I still have some unresolved questions about my Bonnell lineage and had hoped to resolve them myself; however, because I no longer live 10 minutes from the Allen Co. Public Library, it's not happening!

1830 ~ **William Bunnel**, Warren Co., OH, pg. 221 (age 20-30) the next entry is his brother's family, **Benjamin S. Bunnel**, age 30-40.)

In 1833, William purchased land in Washington Co., PA, from his brother, Benjamin and Rachel Bonnel.

**William & Rebecca** brought their family to Jay Co., IN, in the fall of 1838, according to the <u>History of Jay County</u>, (pgs 421-422, biographical sketch on son, **Lewis B. Bonnel**). The same biographical sketch states that **William Bonnel** went to Kansas for a while, after the death of his wife, and then returned to Indiana and died at the home of his daughter, **Hannah Mays.** 

William Bonnel's estate settlement is in Box 58, Jay CO., IN, dated 1 Aug 1877.

Daughter **Hannah May's** death record, 1902 Jay Co., lists parents names as **William Bonnel** and **Rebecca McGinsar**.

Have not been able to locate **William** in the 1870 census – probably was in Kansas.

Have not been able to locate burial locations of William & Rebecca.

#### **ALFRED S. BONNELL INSTANTLY KILLED**

February 2001

**Alfred S. Bonnell**, the well-known retired farmer, was accidentally killed Tuesday afternoon when the derrick used to hoist the wrecked bridge iron from the river collapsed at the site of the former Washington Street Bridge.

The deplorable accident occurred at 5:45, just before quitting time and when an unusually heavy piece of iron was being lifted from the river. Quite a number of bystanders were standing about, some including Mr. Bonnell, being at the extreme end of the pavement and within a wire fence that had been erected to keep back the spectators. One of the guy cables attached to the derrick snapped and the structure was seen to be giving away. There was a general scattering of those about but Mr. Bonnell, possibly for the reason that he did not think the direct was giving away in his direction or because he was standing on the abutment and flight was difficult, apparently made no effort to retreat. Suddenly the heave timbers came down with a crash and one of them struck him squarely on the head crushing his skull and causing instant death. A small boy named Startzman residing on Sandusky St. standing immediately at his side, escaped injury and disappeared in the crowd. He later returned and recovered his cap, which had been knocked from his head. One of the workmen who was also standing on the abutment escaped injury by leaping into the river.

The dead man was removed to an undertaking establishment and later to his home at No. 115 West Davis Street and the funeral will be held Friday. There will be services at the house at 12:30 conducted by Rev. Ayres of Greenspring, after which the body will be taken to Egbert's church, five miles northwest of the city where services will also be held and the interment will be made in the adjacent cemetery.

The deceased had been, until his removal to this city two years ago, living in Pleasant Township where he engaged in farming and where he owned a fine farm one-half mile west of Egbert's church. He was born in 1847 and in 1869 was married to **Emma Norris** who survives. He leaves one son, **Charles**, who resides on the home farm and two daughters, **Mrs. Nellie Smith** and **Miss Mabel** residing at home. The former is a helpless invalid and her father was her almost constant attendant. His mission up town the afternoon of the accident was to procure supplies for her at the office of a physician. The deceased also leaves two brothers, **John**, residing at Watson and Jacob, residing at Wauseon. A sister, **Miss Anna**, resides at Clyde.

#### Tiffin Daily Tribune, April 30, 1913

**Alfred S. Bonnell** aged 66 years, a retired farmer living at No. 115 Davis Street, was instantly killed when a derrick used in hoisting bridge iron from the river bed fell and truck him on top of the head crushing his skull. The accident occurred on the south side of the river on Washington Street late Tuesday afternoon.

A Large crowd had gathered at that point to watch the work of removing the bridge iron from the river, when a guy wire attached to the derrick gave way and the derrick fell to the street. A rush was made by the crowd to get out of the way of the falling derrick, but **Mr. Bonnell** seemingly did not realize his danger in time and the heavy timber struck him causing instant death. William Negele who was standing near the unfortunate man was struck a glancing blow on the shoulder by the derrick. Mr. Negele was able to walk to his home but today is confined to his bed. William Doran, a teamster, jumped into the river to avoid being struck by the falling derrick and escaped injury.
