Correction



"I am glad Edna Voelker is still trying to find the parents of Jonathan Bunnell, as she queried in the last "Newsletter." We keep plugging along, hoping to find the magic key to the puzzle.

I share the interest of Edna Voelker and John Brady in Jonathan Bonnell. Over the past fifteen or more years, I have corresponded with Edna and John and many other people who have been curious about Jonathan's ancestry, with very few tangible results. My interest stems from the apparent relationship between Jonathan Bonnell and my ancestor, David Bonnell.

Along with Edna Voelker, John Brady, and others, I also believe Spotsylvania County, Virginia figured into the history of this branch of the family, though I don't believe they were in Spotsylvania County very long. At the risk of being redundant, I will try to summarize my research in Virginia and early Kentucky for possible clues. Maybe it will be of some help to someone.

A search of Virginia records yielded two references to William Bonnell in Spotsylvania County. The first was a deed in which Paul McClancy(?) and Rose his wife sold land in Spotsylvania County to Peter Roswell 23 April 1772. Witnesses were **William Bonnel**, Jacob Wright and Wm Hall. [Spotsylvania Deed Book H, pgs 218-220]. The second reference to **William Bonnell** was the awarding of letters of administration of the estate of Jacob Wright to **William Bonnell**, Henry Coleman and **Samuel Bonnell** on 20 March 1777. The letters of administration were granted after Ann Wright, widow of Jacob Wright, and Dennies Wright, eldest son of Jacob Wright, gave up all right of Administration. [Spotsylvania Will Book E, pgs 174, 175.] I hired a professional genealogist to search for other records relating to the Bonnells, and he could find no other mention of William Bonnell or any other Bonnell/Bunnell in Spotsylvania County after 1777.

The next reference in Virginia to William Bunnell that I found was in Rockbridge County, Virginia, when Joseph Lyon and **Wm Bunnell** posted bond on 6 April 1792 for the intended marriage of Joseph Lyon and **Rebecca Bonnell**, daughter of **Wm Bonnell** of Rockbridge. [http://www.rootsweb.com~usgenweb/va/rockbridge/images/1792/1792-016.jpg]

Coincidentally, a marriage bond was also issued on 7 May 1787 in Rockbridge County for Anne Wright "Widow of this County" and William Arnold. [http://www.rootsweb.com~usgenweb.va/rockbridge/images/1787/1787-014.jpg] The presence of both "widow" Anne Wright and William Bonnell in Rockbridge County within five years of each other is a strong suggestion that these were the same two people who were connected to Jacob Wright in Spotsylvania County earlier.

A William Bannill was awarded a "Commonwealth's Grant of Patent" in Virginia (now in Kentucky) 4 November 1786. [Commonwealth's Grants of Patents (1779-1801) Now in Kentucky, Military District, Filmed by the Virginia State Library Photographic Laboratory, FHL microfilm 0,007,811]. Several of us speculate that this William Bunnell may be the father of Jonathan, David, Joseph, Peter, John, Samuel, Jeremiah, William, Jr. and other Bonnell/Bunnells who settled in Kentucky in the last two decades of the 18th century. (Incidentally, the same grant of land was listed in the same microfilm in *Fayette County*, Kentucky to a William *Pannell*. Was Pannell yet another spelling of Bunnell? The grant in both listings was identical and was for 150 acres on the "waters of Severns Creek a branch of Hinksons fork of Licking adjoining the lands of Ebenezer Severns.")

Was this the same William Bonnell whose daughter Rebecca married Joseph Lyons, and whose connection with Anne Wright apparently continued from Spotsylvania County to Rockbridge County?

Later Bonnell/Bunnell connections in Kentucky and Indiana with Lyons and Wrights could be coincidental, or could indicate a continuing relationship among these families. **Louisa Bunnell** married David Lyon in 1836 and **Kitty Ann Bunnell** married George W. Wright in 1867 in Mercer County Kentucky. [Mercer County KY Marriage Index.] **David Bonnell** married Nicy Wright in Bartholomew County, Indiana on 16 August 1843. [Bartholomew County Indiana Marriages, Vol.1, 1821-1920, A-Lac, copy of marriage certificate in my possession.]

Another curious fact is the presence of Hugh Lusk, David Lusk, and Samuel Lusk in Rockbridge County, Virginia as indicated in the marriage bond records cited above, and the presence of Hugh, James, John, Samuel and William Lusk in the area that later became Kentucky. Hugh Lusk was among petitioners opposing the erection of the district of Kentucky into a separate state based upon an act concerning the erection Aug. 1787. Samuel Lusk petitioned requesting "Inspection of Tobacco below the mouth of Tate Creek on the lands of Michael Bedinger", Nov. 4, 1787, and Hugh Lusk and Samuel Lusk, in Fayette County, and William Lusk in Mercer County were all listed in the First Census of Kentucky, 1790. (Taken from tax lists.)

David Bonnell's middle name was Lusk, and David's son James P. Bonnell named his son David Lusk Bonnell.

I submit this information, not because it is proof of anything, but it may provide leads or stimulate thought for those others of us who have been trying for years to discover the origins of the Bonnell/Bunnells who showed up in Kentucky in its pioneer period. Evidence that these Virginia Bonnells are the same family as the Kentucky Bonnells is very tenuous, and no firm documentation of relationship has been found. Nevertheless, the nuggets of information we have are intriguing and provocative. I hope someone can apply this to information they have, or at least strengthen some hypotheses they have formed which may lead to proof that these are the Bonnell families we are looking for. The next step would be to link them to the New Jersey Bunnell/Bonnell from whom we believe they descend."

Barbara Barrett, 80 S. Pleasant Rd. #301, Lake Zurich, IL 60074-2292, is still searching for information on her grt-grt-grandmother, Eliza (or Elizabeth) Bonnell. Claude's database shows that she is the daughter of a John and? Bonnel, and possibly born in Camden County, GA. Based on the census data she likely had 2 brothers and 2 sisters, but no information is available on them or on John's ancestry and wife. There was a Bonnell line in GA, but no one has been able to connect John with the known GA Bonnells. Anyone else doing Georgia research?

In the last issue Sylvia Hamilton of Meadow Creek, B.C. queried whether anyone could help her identify the Bunnell who painted two paintings she owns. She has since followed up with a little more information and Claude has some thoughts on who the unknown artist might be.

Sylvia wrote: Hello again and thank you for listing this information in your newsletter. I have since found out a little more information about the area in question. The original artist came from

around the San Franscisco area in the 50's. Maybe this will give you some more input on the location. Thanks for now Sylvia Hamilton

Claude passed on the following: "I searched my database and found a number of artists but I do not know if they painted the type of art you displayed. 

For both families we have completed the states of Arizona, California, Colorado, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho and Illinois. For Bunnells we have also started Indiana. There are no Bonnells or Bunnells registered in Delaware and no Bunnells in Georgia or Hawaii. (? = illegible)

Biographies

This issue I'm running two biographies because they come from the same source and the subjects are cousins. From "Portrait and Biographical Record of Seneca and Schuyler Counties New York," Chapman Publishing Co., 1895

Henry S. Bonnell [CB331829] is well known to the residents of Seneca County, as he was born on the farm where he now resides, four miles northwest of the village of Waterloo, October 14, 1831. His parents were Charles and Deanna (Dell) Bonnell, both of whom were born in Dover County, N.J.

The father of our subject was brought to this portion of the Empire State by his father, Henry Bonnell, when a lad of five years, in 1806. The grandfather located near where Henry S. is now living, and there resided for many years, eventually removing to Wayne County, this state. About this time, Charles attained his twentieth year, and, being given his time, worked out by the month, receiving at first \$9. This was raised to \$10 the second year, and the third year also saw an increase of \$1. He saved the greater part of his earnings, and a few years later went to Michigan and purchased a quarter-section of wild land. He soon disposed of this, however, and in partnership with his brother became the owner of one hundred and fifty acres of land in the town of Galen, Wayne County, this state. This they divided equally, and on his share the father erected a log house and barn. He then began the arduous task of cutting away the trees and placing the land under cultivation. The place he afterward sold to his brother and the property is still in the hands of some of the Bonnell family.

The material grandparents of our subject had friends living in Canada, and on one occasion, when going to visit them, crossed over the land which our subject now owns. The grandmother was greatly pleased with the locality, and on their way back they stopped and purchased it. The following spring they moved upon this new farm, and at that time there were very few houses between them and the little village of Waterloo. Our subject's mother inherited a portion of this farm, and later Charles Bonnell purchased a large amount of the property, owning at one time about six hundred acres.

The parental family included five children, four of whom are now living. Rachel D. married Edmund Mitchell, and is now living in Ontario County. Elizabeth became the wife of William C. Dutton; the family makes their home in the town of Waterloo. Henry S., of this history, was the next-born Phebe W. married Joseph Lynch, and on his death became the wife of Levi Lundy; they are now living in the town of Galen, Wayne County, N.Y. Mary T died when young. The father of this family was a Whig in early life, and a strong anti-slavery man, and cast his first Presidential vote for John Q. Adams. After the organization of the Republican Party he joined its ranks and was a loyal supporter of its candidates until his death, which occurred in 1879. In religious belief he was a Quaker.

The subject of this sketch was fairly well educated, and passed his boyhood days on the home farm. He was married, March 26, 1860, to Miss Elizabeth W. Thorn, who was born in Wayne County. Her parents were Isaac and Rebecca (Palmer) Thorn, well known and highly respected residents of that locality. To Mr. and Mrs. Bonnell there were born six children, of whom Clara died in infancy; Mary T. married George Pletts, and at her decease left two children; Ellen C. married Dillwyn Barton, and they make their home on the old homestead; Stella May died at the age of seventeen years; Dora E. became the wife of H.R.D. Mitchell, and is living in the town of Waterloo; and Charles C. is at home.

Mr. Bonnell cast his first vote for Winfield Scott, and in 1856 supported Fremont. He has since been a firm adherent of Republican principles. Although he has never desired to hold office, he has been frequently solicited to do so. He was reared by Quaker parents, and therefore clings to the faith of that sect.

George A. Bonnell, [CB331836] who is known all over the state as an extensive grower of seed potatoes of the best varieties, is the owner of a well cultivated farm of one hundred and thirty-five acres near Waterloo, Seneca County, which is devoted almost entirely to growing this commodity. Northwestern New York produced the most vigorous seed potatoes, and during the World's Fair our subject sent thirty varieties to Chicago for the State of New York, and later placed on exhibition thirty more varieties under his own name, for which he received two gold medals. The "Empire State Express," "Fast Mail" and "Through Freight" are some of his late productions.

The ancestors of our subject came to America in company with William Penn, and were also Quakers. The grandfather, Henry Bonnell, was born and reared in the State of New Jersey, where he was also married. He came to New York in company with Richard Dell, another Quaker, who went to the land-office at Albany and purchased a farm for both of them. The land was cultivated and improved, and Mr. Bonnell there made his home for several years, when he removed with his family to Wayne County, settling upon property near Clyde. There his son Henry, Jr., the father of our subject, was reared to mature years, although his birth occurred on the estate where George A., of this history, now lives.

Henry Bonnell, Jr., was married to Miss Mary Dell in the old Quaker Church in the town of Waterloo, Seneca County, and soon thereafter purchased the land which our subject now owns, but which was formerly occupied by his father. The later continued to live in Wayne County until his decease, which occurred July 28, 1829. His good wife, who was the mother of a large family of children, survived him many years, passing away in Wayne County, March 17, 1848.

The father of our subject was a great lover of poetry, and could repeat passages from memory by the hour. He was also quite a poet himself, and a short time before his decease wrote a very beautiful poem, entitled, "A Synopsis of Life." His wife was one of the best of women, faithful, loving, and generous to a fault. She was a true helpmate in all the departments of life, and in the devotion to and care of her children had no peer, pursuing the even tenor of her way with such rectitude that they looked upon her as one who could not make a mistake.

The subject of this sketch was born on the farm where he now resides, April 28, 1849. He was the youngest in the parental family of five children, and was given such an education as could be gained in the schools of the district. His father, who was one of the pioneers of Seneca County, early in life began growing potatoes on an extensive scale, and as soon as he was old enough George A. assisted him, thus becoming familiar with all the details of the business.

Mr. Bonnell was married, on Christmas Day, 1876, to Miss May E. Halsted, then a resident of Walworth, Wayne County, N.Y. She was born in Cayuga County, August 20, 1852, her parents being Reuben and Hannah (Halsted) Halsted. Her education was received in the academy in Cayuga County, and she remained with her parents until her marriage. By the union of our subject and his wife there was born one daughter, Adah N., her birth occurring January 9, 1887.

Our subject has always lived on the farm which he now owns. Besides his other interests, he has a fine poultry-yard on his farm, and makes a specialty of raising the Rose Comb Black Minorcas, the Sicilians, Buff Wyandottes, Buff Plymouth Rocks, White Rocks, Black Langshans and Golden Sebright Bantams. In his political views our subject is a strong Republican, and his motto is, "The United States Against the World."

[Ed. Note: The grandparents of both of these men were Henry (CB310098) and Elizabeth (Simcock) Bonnell. Henry's lineage is: William¹, Nathaniel², Samuel³, Benjamin⁴, Jacob⁵, Henry⁶]

Cemeteries

In March my son-in-law, Jeff, and I drove to Michigan to pick up an antique auto. On our way back to Tennessee we stopped in at Bunnell Crossing, KY which we happened to spot on our maps. If you're looking for it, it's just off of I-65, south of Elizabethtown. It is on US 31, which parallels I-65.

From a local storekeeper I learned that there were still Bunnells living in the area and that the name was pronounced with the emphasis on the second syllable. There





is a house on the northeast corner of the intersection where Bunnells reportedly reside. However the residents were driving away just as Jeff and I drove up. Across the street from the house, on the south east side of the intersection is a very small graveyard that is fenced on three sides by a pasture fence that serves to keep the cattle out of the street and the cemetery. In the cemetery are four large and two or three small markers. The small ones are illegible.

Arta Belle Dau. Of Carlos & Myrrell Bunnell Sept 28, 1915-June 16, 1918 She was our sunbeam

Arta Belle is CB013272. Her father, Carlos, is CB007934, who is the son of William and Myra (Houk) Bunnell.

W. W. Bunnell Dec 11, 1858 - jan 18, 1918 He is gone but not forgotten. Rene Bessie Bunnell Wife of W. H. Sturgeon 1882 - 1912

Rene is CB007931, dau. of William & Myra (Houk) Bunnell.

Myra E. Houk Wife of W. W. Bunnell May 3, 1858 - Mar 4, 1914 She was the sunshine of our home.

William Wallace Bunnell, CB006522, is the son of Samuel and Sarah (Smith) Bunnell. His lineage is known only one generation back, Samuel being the son of Peter and Susanna (Erwin) Bunnel. Peter was believed to have been born in VA and died 18 Jan 1868 in Hart County, KY. This appears to be another Kentucky - Virginia Bunnell/Bonnell mystery.

Landmarks

Charles Bunnell, <u>crbunnell@earthlink.net</u>, 3211 Treemont St., SW; Huntsville, AL 35801-3459 sent a photo of him and his wife, Terri, standing near the Bunnell, Florida welcome sign and he asked for info about the town. It's been several years since anything was in the newsletter, so here's what I sent him: There was an article in Vol V, No. 3 of the newsletter and in Vol. XII, No. 1. which we don't have on the web yet, so let me give you some info on the town. It's actually kind of disappointing; no Bunnell dynasty there I'm afraid. This was provided by Phil Bunnelle back in 1991 and was in Vol. V, No. 3, page 38.

"According to one source, the town was founded about 1881 by Alvah A. Bunnell, who built a saw mill there. Another source says that he operated a cypress shingle mill around the turn of the century and prevailed on the railroad to make stops at his plant. For lack of a better name, they

called it the Bunnell stop. By 1903 the settlement, then called Bunnell, was big enough to have a post office. Alvah moved on to Miami about that time, and no other Bunnell seems to have been involved in subsequent development of the town, nor is one living there now [1991]."

In Vol. XII, No. 1, pg. 9, William Brewster Bunnell wrote: "Alvah Alonzo Bunnell, b. 1855, GA, was a wagon & drummer boy in a Fl. Regiment CSA ca. 1864-65. Alonzo died Mar. 1944, Miami, FL. He was later the founder of "BUNNELL, FL", his dad also served w/FL C.S. Forces briefly"



Claude's web site shows Alvah as being born 22 Aug 1854 in Florida (That's probably based on census data). He married Susan Cynthia Godwin 14 Oct 1877. They had 10 children, 8 of whom were boys; there are living descendents. Alvah was the son of Eli and Mary Ann Phebe (Caulder) Bunnell. We don't have his lineage beyond that.

Publications

Louis and Susan Bonnell, 713 Center St, Henderson, KY 42420, sent a published book review on *The* History of Flagler County by John A. Clegg. Flagler County, Florida is where the town of Bunnell is located and the history of Bunnell is covered. The author was at one time the mayor of Bunnell. The book sounds interesting, especially if your interests go beyond "just" genealogy and into the history of an area that you are researching. But, Amazon.com lists the book for \$65 so your interest will have to be strong.

Davis, both served in 3d W. Va. V. I. His wife's grandfather, Benjamin Davis, served in the War of 1812. The Conf. General Pap Price was an uncle of Comrade Price; he is a charter member of Caldwell Post, 21, in which he has passed all the chairs; he is a retired business man, and receives a pension, and his address is Moundsville, West Virginia. (Provided [to the website] by Shirley Fox Allen.)"

[Ed. Note: I was not able to identify Sarah Bunnell. Claude added: "I looked through 1840, 1850, 1860 census and could not find a Fenimore Price listed. I wonder if he might have been James Fenimore. Too many James to find one married to a Sarah of the right dates but I may try."]
