

Hazel M. Savage 98, LaFontaine, formerly of Rochester, passed away at 5 p.m. on Sunday, Aug. 6, 2006 at the Rolling Meadows Health Care Center, LaFontaine.

She was born Dec. 29,1907 in Danville, Ill., to **George Clinton** and **Laura Belle (Keplinger) Bunnell**. One of four children, she lived her early childhood on farms near Chili, Wabash and Peoria.

Savage graduated from Butler High School and attended Manchester



College. While working as a waitress during the summers, she met **W. Scott Savage** of Macy. They were married on April 14, 1929 in the Indianapolis home of **Charles** and **Ella Kroft**. They went on a honeymoon trip the following summer in their new Model A Ford to Yellowstone National Park and to visit Scott's sister, **Marie**, who had homesteaded near Edmonton, Canada.

She lived in Macy from 1929 to 1957, during which time she taught school, was the Miami County truant officer and helped raise four children. The family ran a dairy during the summer, had a large garden, truck patch, and raised chickens for eggs and fryers to sell. She did lots of canning and baking. She enjoyed fishing, going to family picnics, collecting rocks and seashells, hunting mushrooms and watching birds and animals.

When her children entered school, she resumed teaching school and was one of the first kindergarten teachers in Rochester, teaching two sessions - one in the morning and the other in the afternoon, in a church basement. She continued teaching elementary school in Miami and Fulton counties until her retirement in 1972.

After her retirement, she and her husband made many trips with their travel trailer, camping and fishing in Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota and Canada. They spent several winters in their travel trailer at Fort Myers Beach, Fla., where they were often joined by her brother, **Truman.** This was an especially happy time in her life. They went out to eat frequently, had a wide circle of friends and she started doing shell craft work, macrame and crocheting.

Savage had been a member of Grace United Methodist Church, the Indiana State Teachers Association and the National Education Association. After her husband's death on Nov. 9, 1975, she continued her activities as a volunteer member of R.S.V.P., working at the Woodlawn Hospital gift shop, the Fulton County Historical Museum, Fulton County Public Library and as a teaching assistant with Alphabet Box Day Care Center.

Survivors include two daughters, Sharon Savage, Sonoma, Calif., and Anita DuBois and husband Howard, Rochester; two sons, Argyle D. Savage and wife Barbara, Peru, Louis S. Savage and wife Lee Ann, Bluffton, Ohio; 14 grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband; her sister, Irma Stites; and two brothers, Lloyd and Truman Bunnell.

Funeral services will be conducted at 11 a.m. on Friday at Zimmerman Brothers Funeral Home, Rochester, with Mrs. Savage's grandson, the Reverend Doc Newcomb officiating. Burial will follow in the Plainview Cemetery in Macy.

Vnattached Branches

This is probably the most challenging unattached branch I've seen. I'll let Herb Dawson, <u>lhdawson@charter.net</u> or P.O. Box 166, Crum, WV 25669, tell his story. If you have any suggestions to help him in his search please contact him or me with the information.

My ancestor, Charles Barnell (1848-1907) came to America as a stowaway ca 1864. He enlisted in Co. B. 213 Volunteer Pennsylvania Infantry under the alias of **RICHARD NORTH.** He was married in August of 1867 in Gallia County, Ohio as **CHARLES BUNNELL.** He was listed in the 1870 census of Gallia County, Ohio as **CHARLES PENNELL.** I believe most of the records from this point forward were **CHARLES BARNELL.** He is listed in the 1880 census of Jackson County, Ohio as **CHARLES BARNELL.** In the special veterans census of 1890 for Wayne County, WV, he is listed as **CHARLES BARNELL.** In the 1900 census of Wayne County, WV, he is listed as **CHARLES BARNELL.** In the 1900 census of Wayne County, WV in 1907 as **CHARLES BARNELL.** I have been unable to locate him in the 1851 or 1861 census of England or Wales. I have also been unable to find him in the birth records of England or Wales during the time period of from 1837 through 1850.

This past March 2006 I spent a few days in London, England. I did not have time to spend at the Society of Genealogists doing the desired research. I do believe that the English pronunciation of the letter \mathbf{A} as in "BA BA Black Sheep "ave you any wool!" may be closer to the pronunciation used by my great grandfather, Charles Barnell. I suspect that the letter \mathbf{R} was later added to the surname. I cannot be sure until I locate my ancestor somewhere in England. I am not sure how accurate the indexes to birth records for England are? If my ancestor had a different forename or first name than Charles, as well as another spelling for the surname, I really have a difficult job.

I started with BARNELL and changed the vowel A to an E, then to an I, then an O, then a U. BERNELL, BIRNELL, BORNELL, BURNELL. I also tried throwing the R away to create BANNELL. BENNELL, BINNELL, etc. This did not help much either.

My great grandfather said that he used the alias of Richard North to prevent his father from sending to America and making him return. According to family members that I have interviewed

concerning Charles Barnell, he was an only son, and an only grandson. He had a sister, name unknown. He was a small man. His pension records indicate that he was 5 feet, 1 and a half inches tall. His hair was sandy to red in color. He had at least three red headed children. He listed his profession in the military enlistment papers as a "paper stainer!" This would be someone who applied paint to wall paper.

100 Years Ago

Submitted by Betty Smith, curator, Susquehanna County Historical Society 06/21/2006 Items taken from the Independent Republican, the Montrose Democrat and the Tri-Weekly Journal

Dimock - Last Saturday afternoon during the severe storm, Frank E. Bunnell was struck by lightning and instantly killed. Besides being a first-class farmer, he also had a remarkable mechanical bent, and made a specialty of moving buildings. His brother, James, who was with him, was also badly shocked but has completely recovered, while another man employed with them also received a less severe shock. The men, J.W. & L.F. Thornton, Harry Brown, Thomas Oliver, D.G. Underhill and Johnnie Donohoe, were at work moving what had been a creamery building and were waiting for the rain to cease before resuming work.

The Bunnell brothers were seated on the sill of a door and over their heads from the smokestack ran a wire. This wire was not grounded, but the end was fastened in the woodwork a few feet over their heads. The men were conversing with each other when a bolt of lightning struck the stack and ran along the wire. Frank, who was seated nearest the end of the wire, received the full force of the electric current directly on top of the head, causing instant death.

His brother was also rendered unconscious and it was thought for some time he had been fatally injured. The deceased was 38 years of age and is survived by a wife and four children.

Barbara Barrett, <u>Barbchgo@aol.com</u> or 80 So. Pleasant Rd., Unit 301, Lake Zurich, IL 60047-2270, wrote that "I just happened to find this in my paperwork and thought you might like to have it."

I was at the Moultrie-Colquitt Co. Library in GA last year and saw something that interested me. It had several surnames I was interested in so I had it copied. It is a book of names of "English Crown Grants in St. Matthew Parish in Georgia, 1755-1775." Ben W. Fortson Jr. was Secretary of state and Surveyor General while Pat Bryant was Deputy Surveyor General. This was on the cover of the book. Also I had written by pencil more information that was of modern times somewhat, Marion R. Hemperley, Surveyor General Dept. State of GA.

One of the names in this book was a Daniel White "Bonnel," 300 acres, St. Matthew Parish. Granted Book I, page 524 bounded on the south by said grantee.

Comparing those maps to more current ones, it appears that the Ogeechee River is within the boundaries of the St. Matthews Parish. We know that a Daniel Bonnell (CB009436) was granted land in that area after the Revolution. It appears likely that this is the same Daniel Bonnell.]

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Research Tips

Here's some ideas from the Ancestry Weekly Journal and the Ancestry Monthly (both published by Ancestry.com), the Rootsweb Review (published by Rootsweb.com) and National Genealogical Society (NGS) publications.

School records are sometimes maintained indefinitely and may contain all sorts of data. Over the course of growing up some of our ancestors may have attended several different schools. (Ancestry Weekly Journal, 26 August 2006)

Don't overlook small, local libraries and historical societies. (Rootsweb Review, 1 March 2006). My cousin Cecil is spending hours at the historical society in Tioga County, NY and has hit the mother lode of local newspapers. They're not indexed so he's spending a lot of time reading, but the information he has found has been remarkable. And don't overlook the social news sections.

Land Records resulting from the Homestead acts of 1862 (original Homestead Act), 1866 (Southern Act), 1873 (Timber Culture Act), 1874-1879 (Grasshopper Acts), 1904 (Kincaid Act) and 1909 (Enlarged Homestead Act). Also an 1898 law allowed military time to count as time spent on the Homestead, so you may find some military service information in the land records. (NGS News Magazine for October/November/December 2005) Unfortunately the only place not on-line that they seem to be available is the National Archives in Washington, DC.

Bureau of Land Management (BLM) records for patents issued by the federal government between 1820 and 1908 for public land states. This is a website, <u>www.glorecords.blm.gov</u> that is free, very user friendly and includes the lands granted through the Homestead acts. You can even view a copy of the original grant. (NGS News Magazine for October/November/December 2005)

Records relating to occupations: professional organizations, directories and publications (AMA, ABA, Unions, church leaders); appointment authorities (government jobs such as postmasters, pension examiners, lighthouse keeper); special census records (Agricultural censuses, veterans census); licensing offices (town, city or county licenses for bars, pharmacies, auctioneers, etc.), Indigent records (may be state or county). (NGS NewsMagazine for January/February/March 2006)

What in the world does this mean??? The simple explanation is that, across the top in yellow is the identifying name or number for the specific DNA marker that is examined. The numbers below that line represent the value or count of that marker for each individual. Note that some of us had 37 markers tested while some had 12 or 25. The more markers that match for two individuals, the greater the likelihood the two are closely related. Looking at Kenneth and Charles, 35 out of 37 markers match indicating there's a 91% probability they share a common ancestor within the past 12 generations. In this case, it confirms the trail we've built on paper connecting them at the immigrant William. But, in the case of Steven Bonnell (PA) and Steve Bonnell (AZ), there are only 14 of 25 markers that match; that's too much difference to allow predicting a relationship. However, Steven (PA) and James are both part of unattached branches. So for them, their unique markers may be beneficial, **IF** we can get more participation from other unattached branches, such as the Kentucky contingent or descendants of the immigrants Thomas Bonnell (NJ) and Daniel Bonnell (SC). Here are the lines for which we have test results thus far.
