THE LITERARY COUSINS

This quarter we note the literary creativity of several members of the Bunnell/Bonnell family.

First is the new book by Joan England Murray, BUNNELL AND ALLIED FAMILIES. It is an interesting and well-written account of all the known ancestors of Rosa Sarah (Bunnell) England, Joan Murray's paternal grandmother. The book is thoroughly researched, with footnotes on each page to identify the source of her information. The bibliography lists 329 sources, and the book is provided with a complete name index.

Joan has enlived her book not only with family photographs, but also with many copies of documents (deeds, Civil War records, marriage licenses, newspapers clippings, etc.) significant to the family history. In addition, in a feature which I like very much, she has given us the historical background against which the family story was enacted. Altogether an excellent work of which Joan should be very proud. {Incidentally, for Newsletter subscribers who have not yet ordered the book, Joan has offered to extend the prepublication price. Just let her know that you subscribe to the Newsletter.}

I would offer a couple of corrections on pages 34 and 35, The Third Generation of Bunnells. Benjamin and Hannah (Plumb) Bunnell did not move to New Milford, CT until the purchase of the land there in 1714. Their life was spent in New Haven until that time, with the exception of a brief sojourn in Elizabethtown, NJ, where they may have intended to settle. All of their children were born in New Haven except Gershom, who was born 1 May 1707 "in Elizabethtown in east Jersey," according to the New Haven vital records. Isaac was born in New Haven in 1713 after their return. The children's births were all listed in the New Haven vital records as they occurred. However, after the move to New Milford, they were all listed again there, giving rise to the impression that they were born there. Only Keziah, Benjamin's daughter by his second wife, was born in New Milford.

Also, there is a typographical error on page 35 – Benjamin Bunnell died in New Milford on 20 August 1749, not 29 August 1649.

Another fine book, published in 1978, but which has only just come to my attention is DAY UNTO DAY, a Study of the Day Family in America, by Margery Frances Day Hanson. I found an ad for the book in the GENEALOGICAL HELPER. The ad indicated that one of the families covered was "Bonnell," so I ordered a copy. It is a beautiful book, filled with pictures. Since it is a history of Mrs. Hanson's father's ancestry, the Bonnell portion comprises only a small part of the book. Mr. Day was descended from Joanna Bonnell who married Moses Day in January 1785 in Chatham, NJ. Joanna was the daughter of John Bonnell CB300181 and Sarah Carter, his wife. The Bonnell segment includes a picture of the home of John and Sarah Bonnell in Chatham and a copy of John's extensive will and inventory of his estate, all of which were new to me.

After I purchased the book, Mrs. Hanson wrote me a thank you note, which has initiated a very pleasant correspondence. Her book includes

the Huguenot ancestry, which all of you know I reject, and I have explained my reasoning to her. She has expressed her willingness to regard the parentage of William as "on hold," but she is reluctant to dismiss the Huguenot ancestry completely unless I can prove a different one. I invite all of you to join the debate, until we find something definitive one way or the other to print in the Newsletter.

Just as I was putting this issue of the Newsletter together I received a letter from Beverly Sorensen, Northbrook, IL, enclosing a notice of another Bunnell author, her nephew, Eugene Harvey Bunnell, CB360926, who is Father Adam Bunnell, a member of the Franciscan Order. His book, BEFORE INFALLIBILITY, Liberal Catholicism in Biedermeier Vienna, has just been published by Fairleigh Dickinson University Press. According to the brochure, it "is the study of two nineteenth-century priests who tried to transform their church through a new formulation of ancient Truth. Anton Guenther, a Roman Catholic theologian, challenged the pantheistic idealism dominant in the German intellectual world of his day. Johann Emanuel Veith, a medical doctor and convert from Judaism, joined the clergy and found in Guenther's system of contrapositional dualism the thought that undergirded his prolific homiletic output." The brochure goes on to say, "Before Infallibility is an indispensable theological, philosophical, and historical work, written with a great deal of love for Roman Catholicism and from a pluralistic perspective. It is the author's conviction that that the struggle for Truth and meaning demands humility and the willingness to listen with an openness to being changed, and that the study of any era can move beyond quaint antiquarianism to valuable contemporary insight." [What a useful thought for our genealogical studies.]

Father Adam was born in Minnesota. His theological wok was done in Vienna, Austria, and his doctoral work was completed at the Center for

Austrian Studies at the University of Minnesota. He taught for many years at the St. Paul Seminary, now a part of St. Thomas College, in St. Paul, MN. For the last five years he was a professor of history at Regis College in Denver, CO, where he also served as head of the honors program and chaplain. This fall he accepted a position at Bellarmine College in Louisville, KY, where he is teaching European history and working with the Honors Program. He lives at the Franciscan friary at Mount Saint Francis, IN just across the Ohio River from Louisville. There he works with the Mary Anderson Center for the Arts, building a place for artists to come and spend some time creating and exchanging ideas with each other and with the Franciscan. ISAAC BONNELL - A CORRECTION

Claude Bunnell has been working on the Bonnells of Guernsey co, OH, gathering the data necessary to construct a complete lineage of the family there and to identify the Isaac Bonnell, CB005633, who appears to be the progenitor of this branch of the family. In a recent telephone conversation Claude suggested several of the Isaacs who appear in the New Jersey records as possible candidates. To consider his suggestions, and to check other possibilities, I listed all the Isaac Bonnells recorded in New Jersey who were not certainly excluded from consideration by the known facts about them. While I did not come to a definite conclusion on the point in question, I was able to narrow the field a bit, and I shared my results with Claude for his further study.

In the process, however, I discovered that two of the Isaac Bonnells have been confused in all our studies and publications. This article is intended to straighten out the confusion and to demonstrate the reasoning behind it.

In Volume III, No. 2, page 4, of the Newsletter, I referred to ISAAC BONNELL, CB300164, son of Abraham and Mary (Shinn) Bonnell, discussing his supposed marriage to and divorce from Elizabeth Dorn, showing that Isaac's wife was not Elizabeth, but rather her sister Puah Abigail Woodruff.

Now, as a result of my study of all these Isaacs, I have to say that, while we now have the right wife, we have her married to the wrong husband.

Isaac Bonnell, CB300164, and #71 in Ruth Duncan's WILLIAM BUNNELL AND HIS DESCENDANTS, was the son of Abraham and Mary (Shinn) Bonnell. This is proved by Abraham's will, dated 28 January 1768 and proved 1 April 1768, in which each of the named four sons, including Isaac, was given £5. Isaac and his mother Mary were named co-executors of the estate. Abraham had lived for many years in Kingwood, Hunterdon co, NJ, where he died. His four sons, if not born there, were certainly raised in Kingwood.

I can find no other contemporary record which refers without question to this Isaac. However, he is probably the Isaac Bonnell of Kingwood, NJ, who appears in 1778 in the REVOLUTIONARY CENSUS OF NEW JERSEY, by Ken Stryker-Rodda. If so, he cannot be the Isaac Bonnell of Elizabethtown, Essex co, NJ who married Puah Abigail Woodruff.

Now let's step back a generation and consider another Isaac Bonnell, cousin of Abraham. This Isaac, CB290027 and Duncan's #8iv, was the son of Nathaniel Bonnell and Mary Searing. He was born about 1702 in Elizabethtown. In 1736 he inherited land in Elizabeth left to him by his father.

Again, we have no other record that definitely applies to this man. However, it is clear that his residence was Elizabethtown.

ISAAC BONNELL (Cont'd)

Many years ago, on 2 November 1959 to be exact, Homer Baldwin copied and sent me "Wade, Bonnell & Crane Bible Records from Bible owned by Helen Bertha Crane, 220 South Broad St., Elizabeth, N.J. Copied by Evelyn Leary Ogden." I presume he found them in a DAR collection, though Homer did not say so. The record is as follows:

"Children of Isaac Bonnell

1. Hannah Bonnell, b. Oct. 19, 1735.
2. David ", b. Feb. 24, 1739.
3. William ", b. Nov. 28 1740.
4. Sarah ", b. July 26, 1740?
5. Isaac ", b. Dec. 8, 1743.
6. Susan ", b. July 12, 1745.
7. Mary ", b. Sept. 25 1748.
8. Samuel ", b. Oct. 1, 1750.

Deaths.

Sarah, wife of Nathaniel Crane, d. May 15, 1832. David E. Wade, d. Nov. 26, 1832. Isaac Bonnell, d. Mar. 1833."

I know of no other Isaac Bonnell, in Elizabeth, or elsewhere, to whom this record can apply. I believe these are the children of Isaac, son of Nathaniel.

In the Genealogical Magazine of New Jersey, Vol. 43, page 30, the article on New Jersey Rateables, by Kenn Stryker-Rodda, lists, under Essex County, Elizabeth Township, Town Ward, for both January 1779 and February 1780, Isaac Bonnel, householder, exempt, and Isaac Bonnel Jr, householder.

These records almost certainly apply to the two Isaacs, father and son, in the Bible record. The father I believe to be Isaac, son of Nathaniel. Born about 1702, he would have been exempt from military service by reason of age. Isaac Jr, born 8 December 1743, at 34 years would not have been exempt.

The Bible record gives both the birth date, 8 December 1743, and the death date, March 1833 of Isaac Jr, CB300194. This, without question, is the Isaac Bonnell who married Puah Abigail Woodruff.

From "Inscriptions on Tombstones and Monuments in the Burying Grounds of the First Presbyterian Church and St. John's Church at Elizabeth, New Jersey. 1664-1892," by Wm. Ogden Wheeler & Edmund D. Halsey – 1892, we note that gravestone #1734 in the First Presbyterian Churchyard reads:

"The Grave of NOAH BONNELL who died April 3rd 1856 in the 86th year of his age. Also His Father ISAAC BONNELL died March 12th 1833 in the 90th year of his age."

This corresponds precisely with the birth and death dates given in the Bible.

ISAAC BONNELL (Cont'd)

In "WOODRUFF CHRONCILES, a genealogy. The Long Island-New Jersey Family of John Woodruffe, the Immigrant Ancestor to America, "Volume II, compiled by Ceylon Newton Woodruff and Maurine R. Herod – 1971, we find:

"Children of Timothy(5) Woodruff, 1715-1798, #602, and his wife Elizabeth (daughter of Seth Parsons), 1712-1776, #601.

GENERATION VI

. . .

3. Puah(6) Abigail Woodruff, born ca. 1745, died (S.R.) on June 13, 1777. She m. Isaac Bonnell of ElizabethTown who was born in 1744 and who died March 12, 1883, aged 90, (W&H) #1734.

THE NEW ENGLAND HISTORIC GENEALOGICAL REGISTER, Vol. 44, on page 357, has an article entitled, "Record Book of the First Presbyterian Church of Elizabethtown, Essex County (now Elizabeth, Union County), New Jersey." communicated by Edmund Janes Cleveland, of Hartford, Conn. Under the heading, "DEATHS E.TOWN" is listed,

"Wife of Isaac Bonnel June 13, 1777"

The will of Timothy Woodruff of Elizabethtown, dated 6 February 1786, and proved 4 February 1799, as abstracted in "New Jersey Post-Revolutionary Documents, Calendar of Wills—1796-1800," provides, among other things, "Grandsons, David and Seth Bonnel, each 40 shillings, when 21. Grandson, Noah Bonnel and granddaughter, Betsey Bonnel, each £5, when of age. Said Bonnel grandchildren being the children of Isaac Bonnel."

Isaac Bonnell appears in the 1830 census in Elizabeth: one male between 40 and 50 and one male between 80 and 90.

In summary, ISAAC BONNELL, husband of Puah Abigail Woodruff and father of Noah, David, Seth and Betsy, was the son of Isaac, not Abraham, as proved by the Bible record. Careful study of all the possibilities makes it clear that Isaac, the father, was CB29 0027, Duncan's #8iv, son of Nathaniel and Mary (Searing) Bonnell. This family was always of Elizabethtown, but none of Abraham's descendants seem to have resided there.

Those of you who have purchased WILLIAM BUNNELL AND HIS DESCENDANTS may wish to enter this correction, since the line is carried down for several generations.

Jerry Hatch, Chicago, IL, shares with us the following little story of young love unfulfilled:

Sibbel J. Bunnell 1832 – 1876

Sibbel Jane Bunnell was born at Port Byron, NY, 16 February 1832, daughter of Joseph Bunnell, CB320846, and Ann Cooper. In about 1848-50 Sibbel stitched two samplers, one of which is shown here with her picture. The other sampler bears the initials "B.C." in addition to Sibbel's name. The story is that Sibbel had fallen in love with B. Chapman, but her parents broke up the engagement. In spite, Sibbel later eloped with Samuel Devore, whom she married 18 December 1851. Sibbel's mother never forgave her. The end of the love story – Sibbel and B. Chapman are buried near each other, as the Devore and Chapman burial plots are adjacent at Mount Pleasant, Old Port Byron, Town of Mentz, Cayuga co, NY.

This tale was recoded years ago by Marion Ryal Lambert, great granddaughter of Sibbel Bunnell Devore, and aunt of Robert Ferris. Jerry Hatch wrote hat he visited his distant Bunnell cousins, Bob and Shirley Ferris, Hornell, NY, on a recent vacation family research trip. Bob shared notes, photos and samplers relating to his great great grandmother, Sibbel Bunnell Devore [William(1), Nathaniel(2), Joseph(3), David(4), David Elias(5), Henry(6), Joseph(7), Sibbel(8)].

Sibbel J. Bunnell and Samuel Devore had three children: Clara Joan Devore, b. 23 June 1853, d. 6 October 1922, m. 25 February 1874 George Washington Ryal; Livona Devore, b. 1854, thought to have d. young; and Sherman E. Devore, b. 9 September 1861-2, d. September 1927, m. 10 July 1895 Margie W. Loveless.

Who Was Dr. Bunnell?

I received the following comments with subscription renewals:

From Jan Clemmer, Salem OR – "In the NPB presentation of 'The Civil War', did you notice the photo of an embalming establishment owned & operated by Doctor Bunnell? How could we go about tracing it?"

and from Mary B. Spies, Spokane, WA – "While watching the CIVIL WAR epic on TV last week I noticed 'Bunnel'! apparently an embalmer, did anyone else notice that? seems to me it was in the 3rd show."

Thank you both. I did not see the TV program, but from everything I have read, it was very well done. I don't know who Dr. Bunnell was, but I seemed to remember a picture of a Civil War embalming establishment. After digging through my notes and files, I found the picture, sent to me around 1970 by Doris (Bunnelle) Thomas, Garden Grove, CA. She labeled the picture "Photograph of a Field Mortuary from a book on the Civil War 'They Who Fought Here,' by Bell Irvin Wiley and Hirst D. Milhollen, MacMillan Co., 1959, NY."


