¶ Clement M. Bonnell, III, called me to point out an error on page 46 of the last newsletter, Vol. V, No. 4. In the seventh line of the summarized article on HENRY BONNELL, 2d, I stated that Connecticut Farms, NJ, where Henry's first wife was buried, is now known as New Providence. That is not correct. The community then known as Connecticut Farms, Essex co., NJ, is now Union, in Union co, NJ. Please note the correction on your copy. Thanks, Clem, for your help.

¶ William Bunnell, Concord, NH, obtained for me a copy of THE PICTORIAL HISTORY OF BUNNELL, FL, published in 19888 by The Pioneers of Bunnell to celebrate the 75th year since the incorporation of the town. I think it is an excellent example of its type–many, many pictures and interesting text filling 118 pages in a soft-cover binding. It is disappointing from our point of view that there is only a single reference to the Bunnell family for which the town was named: "Alvah A. Bunnell had established a cypress shingle mill near the railroad. To identify the stop for mail and to let off passengers it was called the Bunnell stop–thus it became known as Bunnell." That is the only reference to anyone by the name of Bunnell. Bill Bunnell learned that they have about 50 copies left if any of you would like one. The cost is \$15 plus \$1.67 postage. They can be ordered from Mr. Otis Stone Hunter, Route 1, Box 28-A, Bunnell, FL 32010.

¶ Miss Jane Bell Morey, Concord, NH, sent me a number of newspaper clippings from local papers which mentioned various members of the Bunnell family. ??? BENJAMIN BUNNELL OF MIAMITOWN, OH ???

Several of my subscribers have been searching for the ancestry of the Benjamin Bunnell who was born in New Jersey in 1761 or 1762. He married HANNAH GOLDEN< who was born in 1758 in New Jersey. Several of their children were born in New Jersey, but some time after 1785 they removed to Hamilton Co, OH. Unfortunately, the census records for Hamilton co for 1800 and 1810 were lost. However, Benjamin appears in the tax lists for Miami twp, Hamilton co, in 1808 and 1810. By 1820 Benjamin "Bunnel" appears in the census in Whitewater twp, Hamilton co" 000101-00102. In 1830 he is still in Whitewater twp, as Benjamin "Bonnell": 0000100001-000010001. He died at Miamitown, Hamilton co, and was buried in the Miami Cemetery at Miamitown. His gravestone reads: "BENJ. BUNNELL Died Oct. 30, 1847. In the 86th year of his age."

The 1820 census record was sent to me by Shirley Stone, the 1820 and 1830 records by Mrs. Harry Atleson, while the Miami twp tax data and the 1820 and 1830 census records are found in the CB Database. A recent photograph of Benjamin's gravestone was sent to me by Dorothy Hanaway. All other data in the above account (except the reference to son Isaac) was submitted by Benjamin's descendants, Lynn Arnold, Charleene Ireland-Harmon, and Vera Reeve. Data on the families of Sarah and Mary came from PORTRAIT AND BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES OF THE WILLAMETTE VALLEY, OR, and HISTORY OF CINCINNATI AND HAMILTON COUNTY. Much of the information was gathered years ago by Emma Arnold and Delight Kerr.

Benjamin Bunnell (Cont'd)

The early researchers concluded that this Benjamin was the same as the Benjamin Bonnell, Jr., who married Hannah Ward, and that Hannah Golden was his second wife. This was not correct. Benjamin Bonnell, Jr., son of Benjamin and Rachel (Van Winkle) Bonnell, died 9 October 1808 in Springfield twp, Essex (now Union) co, NJ, at the age of 57 years, 7 months and 5 days. This puts his birth year at 1751, ten years earlier than our subject. He married Hannah Ward, who survived him and married (second) in 1810 Elder Moses Miller. This Benjamin lived all his life in New Jersey. He was buried in Chatham, Morris co, NJ.

Who, then, were the parents of Benjamin Bunnell, 1761-1847? There are at least two possibilities, depending on whether he was actually Benjamin, Jr., or not. Was he called Jr. by the early researchers because they identified him with the other Benjamin who was a junior? Or did they know from family records or traditions that his father's name was also Benjamin, and the Benjamin who married Hannah Ward was the only Benjamin, Jr., they could find?

Let me list several pieces of stray data:

- 1. The Hatfield Family Bible states that Aaron Bonnell was born 30 March 1749 in New Jersey, the son of Benjamin and Eleanor Bonnell.
- 2. Aaron was married in Mendham twp, Morris co, NJ, in 1772. One of the bondsmen for his marriage was Benjamin Bonnell.
- 3. Benjamin Bunnel, householder, with 8 acres of land and 1 horse, exempt from military service, was listed in the tax list in Mendham twp, Morris co, NJ, in June 1778. He does not appear in the list in Mendham in June 1780.
- 4. Benjn Buneel with 2/3 of a gristmill was listed in the tax list of Hanover twp, Morris co, NJ, in Feb. 1780 (but not in 1778). In the same list was a John Bunnel who had 1/3 of a gristmill. Was he Benjamin's partner?
- 5. The 1793 census of New Jersey men eligible for service in the militia lists Benjn. Bonnell, Jr., in Essex co., and Benj. Bunnell in Morris twp., Morris co, NJ.
- 6. The will of Thomas Bonnell of Hanover twp, Morris co, NJ, dated 23 January 1788, was probated 11 May 1790 and mentions among others a son Benjamin.

Now let's examine the two possibilities:

First: If Benjamin was <u>not</u> known to have been a Jr., he could have been the son who was mentioned in the will of Thomas Bonnell of Hanover twp. He would certainly have been too young to have been the householder in Mendham twp in 1778, but Benjamin Bunnell or Bonnel or Bonnal continues to appear in the Hanover twp tax lists in 1781, 1783, 1785, 1786, 1787, 1789, 1790. 1791, 1792, 1793 and 1795. He would probably have been the militiaman of 1793. After 1795 Benjamin does not appear in the tax lists, which continue until 1822. This would seem to fit with the move to Ohio sometime after 1795. Benjamin Bunnell (Concl'd)

It should be noted that Paul J. Bunnell, in his book THUNDER OVER NEW ENGLAND, has suggested that Benjamin, the son of Thomas of Hanover, was the Benjamin Bonnell, Loyalist, who served in the British army in the Revolution and who emigrated to New Brunswick, Canada, in 1783. If so, he could not have been the Benjamin who appears in the tax and militia records in the 1790's. I am not aware of any evidence to support this relationship except that Thomas of Hanover had a daughter named Affa and Benjamin of New Brunswick named a daughter Alphia.

Second: If Benjamin <u>was</u> known to have been a Jr., he may well have been another son of Benjamin and Eleanor Bonnell. If so, he would have been 12 or 13 years younger than his brother Aaron (which suggests that Benjamin and Eleanor might also have been the parents of some of the other unattached Bonnells of that period).

The Benjamin Bunnell in Mendham in 1778 was probably the father of Aaron, and he may have been the Benjamin who appears in the Hanover twp tax lists until 1795. However, note that in the tax list of July 1785 he is listed as Benjamin Bonnal, Jr., the only time he is so recorded. It seems likely, or at least possible, that the later references are to the younger Benjamin who married Hannah Golden.

The Benjamin who was listed in the Morris co militia in 1793 could not have been the elder Benjamin, since he was old enough to be exempt from militia duty as early as 1778. Likewise, it could not have been the Loyalist Benjamin wince he had left the country ten years before. I suggest that it was Hannah Golden's husband. He was not called Benjamin, Jr., in the list, and probably the elder Benjamin had died some time before. Note that the husband of Hannah Ward was specifically listed as Benjamin, Jr., in the Essex co militia in 1793, since his father was still living.

It is important to recognize that all this is merely guesswork on my part. However, I believe it suggests possibilities which warrant intensive investigation. It provides a focus for the research of Benjamin's descendants. Questions which need answers include:

- Was Benjamin known to be a Jr. <u>before</u> he was erroneously identified with the Benjamin, Jr. of Essex co?
- Who were Hannah Golden's parents and where did they live? In Morris co? Did her father or mother leave a will?
- Do the land records of Morris co identify the particular property owned by the senior Benjamin, and is there any indication that the younger Benjamin acquired the same property?
- Is there a deed which shows the sale of property in Morris co by Benjamin and Hannah when they left for Oho? It would be between 1795 and 1800.
- Is there a deed which shows the sale of property in Morris co by Benjamin and Hannah when they left for Ohio? It would be between 1795 and 1800.
- Is there a probate record following the death of the senior Benjamin?

If anyone can throw any further light on this relationship, either positively or negatively, please let me know. Our success in establishing the parentage of Miles Bunnell in this way encourages me to hope for the best in this case..

DOES ANYONE KNOW THIS MAN?

Louise Nemecek, Richmond, VA, wrote to me in August asking for help in identifying the ancestry of her grandfather FRANKLIN BUNNELL. Claude Bunnell was once again able to pull the necessary information out of his Database, along with data from a Family Group Sheet sent to me by Paula Bonnell Sacco in 1987.

Louise found an old glass over wood photo among her father's effects, which may be that of her great grandfather, Samuel Bonnell. She had a copy made for the Newsletter, and the photo studio thinks the picture was originally taken in the 1870's. If the photo was indeed one of her direct

Bonnell ancestors, it would have to be of Samuel, who was born in 1839. Samuel's father was in his 70's at the time, and his son Franklin was in his teens. Samuel appears in the 1850 census in District 21, Harrison co, WV, and in the 1880 census in Center twp, Chautauqua co, KS. The picture was probably taken in Kansas. Can anyone tell us definitely whether or not this is a picture of Samuel Bonnell?

Names on the Land

In Volume III, No. 3, of the Newsletter I printed an account of the life of George William Bonnell, for whom Mount Bonnell in Austin, TX, was named. Gwen Quickel, Lake Jackson, TX, sent me an article which appeared in a Texas newspaper last June describing the beauties of Mount Bonnell and its associated park. Although the article makes no mention of how the spot got its name, I thought you might be interested in what is there and how to get there. I have abridged the article slightly and deleted the pictures for lack of space.

Austin's Mount Bonnell

Mount Bonnell has long been a favorite of young lovers, especially Austin's university students. They turn to the mountain for dates, film projects and privacy for secret, after-curfew parties.

During the daylight hours, families a view so spectacular that in 1839 Gen. Sam Houston declared it must be "the very spot where Satan took our Saviour to show and tempt Him with the riches and beauties of the world."

Since the 1930s, the 775-foot promontory officially has belonged to Austin's residents as a city park. Visitors climb a cedar-shaded stairway of 100 or so uneven steps made of gray and tan stone. At the top, a rocky gravel path disappears into trees to the right and the left.

Directly ahead is a gazebo with pillars and a knee-high wall made of the same rough-cut stone. Slats of weathered wood filter the sun. Immediately beyond the wall, the ground falls abruptly away. The nearly vertical, 300-foot face of the cliff is covered by tough mesquite trees. The Colorado River flows below.

Lining the shore below and across the from the gazebo attracts families. It river are \$1 million-plus homes with elaborate balconies and private docks.

Across the water, the sun sets behind tree-covered hills. The horizon is punctuated by eight or so spindly radio towers topped with red lights.

Here is a refuge for lovers and artists. But it doesn't matter whether you fit either description. On Mount Bonnell, you will feel like one.

A woman in bluejeans leans back against her boyfriend's legs as he massages her shoulders.

A twentysomething man in white shorts and a blue chambray shirt sits alone on the wall with his knees drawn up. He takes a drag on his cigarette and stares at the disappearing sun. Then he notebook again. A novel, perhaps, or a love letter.

A group of men and women in party clothes chat animatedly as they climb the stairs. When they reach the clearing, a hush falls over the group. "Oh, this is beautiful," one woman in a red dress murmurs.



The broad path that leads to the right

slopes gradually down and around to the roadside parking area. Here is easy access for the elderly, the handicapped and others (such as people with heavy picnic baskets) who want to avoid the ong stairway to the summit.

At the bottom of the slope, the view across the river is unobstructed and almost as expansive as that from the highest point. Like most of Mount Bonnell, however, there are few guardrails lining the cliff's edge, and adults need to keep a watchful eye on children.

HOW TO GET THERE: From Loop 1 in Austin (locally known as Mopac), take the 35th Street exit. Go west on 35th Street as far as you can and turn left at the water treatment plant. Take the drive to Mount Bonnell for picnics with picks up his pen and writes in his next right, Mount Bonnell Road, and drive up the hill to the staircase on the left. There is a small, roadside parking area. Those unable to climb the stairs can drive to the farthest end of the parking area and walk up the gravel road there. The park is open 5 a.m.-10 p.m. everyday.

GEORGE LEE BUNNELL CB331145, son of George Washington Bunnell CB320747, was born 18 March 1874 in North Carolina. He married MARY JANE HUFFMAN, who was born 30 September 1876. George died in August 1948, and Mary Jane died 10 September 1956. They were buried in the cemetery of the Cumberland Union Baptist Church, Cumberland CO, NC. They were the parents of five children Alice Lee, who died at the age of three years; Berline, m. Hoseh Strickland; Annie, m. William Calfin Faircloth; John, m. Mable Caviness; and Ella, m. Shelton Britt Edge. Paul J. Bunnell, author of THUNDER OVER NEW ENGLAND, BENJAMIN BONNELL, THE LOYALIST, writes that he has opened up an entirely new area of research on his family and Benjamin because shipping comes into the picture quite a bit. It appears that the Bonnells lost their shirts in shipping when their few ships were lost at sea or burnt. He listed three ships belonging to the Bonnells:

E. W. BONNELL, a 198 ton schooner, built for Bonnel & Son by Robert Jenkins. This ship went ashore on one of the Caicos Islands in February 1882.

C. E. WHITE, of 227 tons. The dimensions were 111.4 x 27;.9 x 10.5, built in 1886 at Saint John, New Brunswick, by F. L. Bonnell. F. S. Bonnell was the managing owner and A. L. Bonnell was the Master. This ship loaded a cargo at Digby, Nova Scotia, and headed for Cienfuegos, Cuba, on 1 August 1889 and was never heard from again.

M. L. Bonnel, of 297 tons. The dimensions were 127.4 x 31 x 10.9, built in 1889 at Saint John, New Brunswick, for the Bonnells. Due to hard times the ownership was transferred to F. Ritchie and it was destroyed by fire on 5 January 1897. The ship was named after one of the Bonnell wives, Martha L. Bonnell. Paul has a photograph of a painting of a ship.

We will look to hear more from Paul on this subject as his research progresses.
