#### THE FIRST CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES – 1790

One of the most valuable genealogical tools we have is the United States census. Listed below are all the Bunnell, Bonnell and Burnell entries, with their various spellings, which I have found in the surviving records of the 1790 census. Most of these I copied directly from the printed volumes of the census. Others come from Claude Bunnell's Database, particularly the various Burnell spellings. Please let me know if you discover any that I have missed.

Unfortunately, not all the 1790 census still exists. The surviving returns for 1790 are published in HEADS OF FAMILIES AT THE FIRST CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES TAKEN IN THE YEAR 1790. They cover Connecticut, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, North

Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina and Vermont. Missing are Delaware, Georgia, Kentucky, New Jersey, Tennessee and Virginia. Of greatest concern to us is the loss of the 1790 New Jersey census. (The New Jersey census returns for 1800, 1810 and 1820 are also lost.) The list below would be considerably longer if we could add the New Jersey Bonnells.

The first column gives the state, followed by the county and the town. Next is the six-digit CB# from Claude's Database, then the name of the Head of Family as it appears in the return. The last column shows the enumeration of the family in five categories, as follows:

Free White Males of 16 years & upwards including Heads of Families

Free White Males under 16 years

Free White Females, including Heads of Families

All other Free Persons

Slaves

A few of the names on the list call for comment. First, all CB numbers of 290000 or higher represent individuals whose descent from the immigrant William Bunnell has been determined. They fall in the fourth, fifth and sixth generations from William.

Going down the list: Emely Burnal is a male. He is apparently the same person whose name was read as Conbley Bunnell CB004144 in the 1800 census of Currituck co, NC, 21010-10101. The will of Embly Bunnell of Currituck co, NC, was written 12 November 1802 and proved 31 January 1803.

Eneas Bunnel represents Enos Bunnell.

Frank Bunnel of East Haddam was non-white, with four members in his family. He may have been Indian or Black, and may have been a freed slave.

The 1790 Census (Cont'd)

Hannah Bunnet, is a misreading for Hannah Bunnel. She was Hannah Tyler, widow of Isaac Bunnell, CB310002.

I suspect that Hannah Bunnels and Hannah Bunnet are the same person, who somehow got counted twice in the 1790 census, but that is just a guess.

Jerus Bunnel represents Jairus Bunneli.

Joel Bunnel, CB001480, is unidentified as to parentage in the Database. However, after considerable study I am convinced that this is a misreading for Jehiel Bunnell, CB300087. Both the census numbers and the location fit Jehiel's family perfectly, and there seems to be no other Joel who could fit.

Unice Bunnel represents Eunice Bunnell. She was Eunice Rowe, widow of Reuben Bunnell.

I would be glad to respond to any questions or comments you may have about this data. Any information you can provide about the persons not identified as descendants of William would be particularly appreciated.

Through the generosity of Mr. Bonnell, the house and farm he loved are now open to the public at no charge.



The Herbert Bonnell Museum can be reached from the Dearborn exit off 1-29, half way between Kansas City and St. Joseph, Missouri. Froa» Dearborn, take H Highway west one mile to Mo. 371, south one mile through New Market, then west again on H two miles to P Highway. Go one mile south to the first crossroads, then east on Lamar Road one-half mile to the farm.

From Downtown Weston, take Welt St north to its junction with Highway 45, where Welt becomes Highway P, Take P 5-1/2 miles north to the fifth crossroads, and east on Lamar Road one-half mile to the farm.

#### Herbert Bonnell Museum (Cont'd

In searching through my notes and through Claude Bunnell's Database, I could not find any reference to Herbert Bonnell. Noting from the brochure that Herbert died in 1984, I checked the listing of Social Security Deaths, and found Herbert Bonnell, born 6 October 1893, died November 1984 in Weston, Platte co, MO. For further information about him and his family, we will wait for Marjorie's report.

Last year Bob and Marjorie visited Indiana and Kentucky and sent in to the Newsletter pages of Bunnell and Bonnell data they obtained there. It has been extremely useful in developing the Kentucky families which were highlighted in the April issue. Vol. VI, No. 2.

Marjorie is the great-great granddaughter of Louisa J. Bonnell and Lewis J. Cox. Louisa's father, David Bunnell or Bonnell was born in Virginia or Kentucky in 1792. After the birth of a son in 1817, David and his family moved to Warren co, IN, then to Bartholomew co, IN, then to Platte co, MO, then to Leavenworth co, KS, where he appears in the 1860 census living with Lewis and Louisa Cox.

So far, we have not been able to determine who David's parents were. There are several indicators which suggest that he should have been closely related to the Jonathan Bonnell who married Rebecca Dean. However, no actual connection has been found, unless Marjorle has discovered it during her recent trip.

Here is a picture of Louisa J. Bonnell, daughter of David. She was born 6 July 1825 in Indiana, and died 11 October 1907 in Kansas. She married Lewis Cox on 30 September 1841. She and Lewis were the parents of nine children.

#### MORE ON KENTUCKY BUNNELLS

In the April 1992 issue of the Newsletter I printed references which suggested that the father of many of the Kentucky Bunnells and Bonnells might have been a William who cane from Virginia. Here is another reference to a William in Virginia, sent to me by Christine Kraft of Lawrence, KS. She found it on page 808 of THE 1787 CENSUS OF VIRGINIA, compiled by Netti-Schreiner-Yantis and Florence Speakman Love and published by Genealogical Books in Print, Springfield, VA, 1987.

Rockbridge Co., VA Personal Property Tax, List B, 1787. William BONNELL charged with tax for himself, 1 horse and 1 cattle.

If the Virginia tax lists are similar to those of other states I have seen for this period, the list gives no indication as to whether this William Bonnell was single or was married with a family.

I just received a letter from Joan Murray of Palatine, IL. She says:

"Yesterday I was at the Milwaukee Public Library doing research, when I came across some Bunnells in a set of four volumes, 'Cemetery Records, Mercer County, Kentucky, Harrodsburg Historical Society, July 1969-70.'

Joan goes on to say:

"As an aside, anyone searching Mercer County, Kentucky, should also check into the Pleasant Hill Shaker records (which are available through the Eastern Kentucky University.) I went through 19 reels of their microfilm about 10-12 years ago as my Bantas lived in the Shaker community. At that time I found Bunnells in the records, but did not copy any of it as I was inundated with copying all the Banta material I found in the records.

#### Kentucky (Cont'd)

"I don't know who these Bunnells are, but they may have come into that area from either Virginia or Pennsylvania. My Bantas who lived there were born in New Jersey, moved into Pennsylvania and then went to Kentucky in 1780. There was a huge Dutch group in Mercer County, Kentucky with Somerset County, NJ roots. Perhaps this information will be of some use to some Bunnell struggling out there."

In the article in the April Newsletter I mentioned a couple of Bunnells who appeared in the 1850 and 1880 census records in the Pleasant Hill Shaker Community. If anyone has the time and interest to search the Shaker records which Joan mentions, I would be glad to publish the findings.

I was ultimately successful, I think, in identifying each of the burial records listed above. However, there are some significant differences between these records and data I have received from other sources.

The first two records are for BENJAMIN BUNNEL and MARY BUNNEL, wife of Benjamin. I believe that the statement that Benjamin died 12 July 1836, age 7 months, is in error. If I am correct, this is BENJAMIN D. BUNNELL CB011238, son of Samuel and Elizabeth (Sutterfield) Bunnell, who was born 2 September 1799. He married his cousin MARY BUNNELL, daughter of William and Mary (Allen) Bunnell. He died of typhoid on 28 November 1858. Mary, born 21 May 1808, died 16 September 1871, not 1914 when she would have been 106 years old. This information was sent to me by Marjorie Gibbs, who did extensive research in a variety of Mercer co records.

J. A. BUNNEL, the next record, is JAMES A. BUNNELL CB006497, son of Benjamin and Mary.

The record for WILLIAM T. BUNNELL CB006520, son of Samuel and Nancy Ann (Harris) Bunnell, gives me more precise birth and death dates than I had previously. Other sources give his year of birth as 1845, 1846 or 1847. (Samuel and Nancy had 11 children, and the birth dates of nearly all of them are disputed.) This record is probably the most authentic.

MIRIAM E., wife of WILLIAM, died 5 July 1889, or 5 July 1887 according to the information sent by Marjorie Gibbs.

WILLIAM T. married (second) in 1892 in Mercer co MARTHA \_\_\_\_\_\_, who survived him. She is probably the MATTIE E. BUNNEL listed in the record above.

B. F. BUNNELL, buried in Springhill Cemetery, is certainly BENJAMIN F. Bunnell CB006454, brother of William T. His gravestone says he was born in 1851. Other sources list his birth as occurring in June 1846, about 1847, or in 1850. Since he appears in the 1850 census in Mercer co living with his parents, I conclude that one of the earlier dates is more likely than 1851.

Turning to the burials in Ebenezer Church of Christ Cemetery, I'll start at the bottom of the list. FREDERICK BUNNELL CB006483, was a brother of William T. and Benjamin F. His record also gives me more precise dates of birth and death. He married TENNESSEE NAVE, whose death record I did not have before.

#### Kentucky (Cont'd)

L. W. BUNNELL was LYNNWOOD W. BUNNELL CB006484, son of Frederick and Tennessee. He married MALINDA H. BUNTON, the M. H. BUNNELL of this record.

I was unable to identify DAVID B. AND ANNIE PEACH BUNNELL from the records already compiled in my computer. I turned to Claude Bunnell's Database and found DAVID BUNNELL CB007950 who was born in September 1881 in Kentucky. He married in 1904, in Mercer co, KY, ANN PEARL ANDERSON, who was born in 1885 in Kentucky. Claude's reference for the marriage record is page 380, vol. 20 of the vital records of Mercer co. David and Ann had a son Leslie, born in 1905, who appears with them in the 1910 census in South Elkhorn, Fayette co, KY. The person who copied the gravestone apparently misread Pearl as Peach,

The Database lists David's father as FRANK BURMELL CB007949, born in June 1849 in Kentucky, married in 1875 BELLE \_\_\_\_\_, who was born in June 1856 in Kentucky. Frank's parentage is unknown in the Database. The only reference cited for this couple is the 1900 census for District 1, Point, Henderson co, KY, where Frank was listed as a day laborer. Their two sons were living with them: David, already mentioned, and Benjamin F. CB007951, born in November 1883.

Comparing this data to information already compiled, it seems clear that FRANK BURMELL CB007949 was the same person as BENJAMIN F. BUNNELL CB006454, whose name was almost certainly Benjamin Franklin Bunnell. Benjamin married BELLE FREEMAN in Mercer co, KY. They appear in the 1880 census in McAfee, Mercer co, with their first two children, Edward and Ella Pearl. Belle appears as a widow in the 1910 census, again in McAfee, Mercer co, with the notation that she was the mother of four living children. Who were the other two? I submit that they were David B. and Benjamin F., Jr. Could it have been some kind of construction job that took Benjamin (or B. F., or Frank) to Henderson co where he was working as a day laborer in 1900?

This illustrates the importance of bringing together all the miscellaneous scraps of information whatever the source. Many times I have been able to make connections by comparing fragments that taken by themselves were meaningless. I am grateful to Joan for sending in these records, and encourage all of you to keep on submitting any Bunnell/Bonne 11 items you find, however insignificant they might seem.
