COMMENT

The number of deaths that have been reported this quarter is larger than usual. We particularly regret the deaths of two of our subscribers, Mrs. Charles E. Loucks of Arlington, VA, who died on 27 September 1992, and Mrs. Myron Woolsey of Deming, NM, who died on 25 November 1992. In addition, several subscribers lost close family members. Hugh F. In the last Newsletter I asked for your comments on the desirability of forming a Bunnell/Bonnell Family Association and/or convening a family reunion. I was somewhat disappointed when only 15 out of 127 individual subscribers responded. Of the responses, one was negative. The other 14 ranged from cautiously to enthusiastically positive.

Beverly Sorensen, Northbrook, IL, is "wholeheartedly for it" and "will help where I can." Patricia Bunnell, Canton, MI, wrote, "Yes, the idea of a family association is great. I do not have a computer, but I do have a word processor ... If the country were divided into areas I could handle Mich. and Ohio. Just a thought, I will get involved."

Richard J. Lesser, Montville, NJ, offered this; "With regard to your ongoing suggestion to form a Bunnell-Bonnell family Association, may I offer the following suggestion?...Since it would be logistically very difficult to bring such a large group together for a 'National' reunion, perhaps it might be a wiser idea to try to form 'State' Associations or groups and build upon that idea, so that we could eventually have Bunnell-Bonnell Reunions on a State-wide Basis."

A family association requires the active involvement of a number of people. One or two cannot carry the load alone. And a reunion, to be successful, requires a lot of planning and preparation. Dick Lessor's suggestion is a very good one. Pat Bunnell has offered to get involved in Michigan and Ohio. Would anyone care to start the ball rolling in another state?

In perusing my copy of the September-October issue of EVERTON'S GENEALOGICAL HELPER I found, as always, a number of articles and advertisements of particular interest to me. Joan E. Murray, one of our subscribers, has an excellent article on pages 6, 7 and 8, entitled "Writing My Family History." This describes her experiences in researching and writing her first book, THE BANTAS OF PLEASANT HILL, KENTUCKY, THEIR ANCESTORS AND DESCENDANTS. Many of US are familiar with her second book, BUNNELL AND ALLIED FAMILIES.

Also in this issue of the HELPER, on page 170, is an ad from Sharon Meeker, offering to do professional genealogical research in northern New Jersey, Sharon was a subscriber to the Bunnell/Bonnell Newsletter for several years. She was Sharon Holley at the time.

Joan E. Murray, 1281 N Linden Ave, Palatine, IL 60067, sends us further information about the records of the Shakers at Pleasant Hill, KY:


"After reading the information I had sent you regarding the availability of the film on the Shakers, I thought I had better get more specific. I didn't think that you would be printing all that or I would have given you further information so that people wouldn't have difficulty getting to the exact source of it. First of all to order the film, the researcher will need to belong to a library that is part of a nationwide interlibrary loan program. Since there are several state universities in the eastern part of Kentucky, I thought you should have the full name and address of the university in case anyone contacts you regarding the Shaker records. It is University of Kentucky Library, Special collections and Archives, 111 King Library North, Lexington, KY 40506-0039. While this library has all nineteen rolls of film, the originals of some of this material are also available in two other places. Only the original journals for M-206, Reels 1-3 are housed at this library. There is a manuscript collection at the Filson club in Kentucky and the reels covering this collection are identified as the Filson Club Shaker reels 1-7. Also there is a manuscript collection at Western Reserve Historical Society in Cleveland and these are identified as Western Reserve shaker reels 1-9. All these reels pertain to Pleasant Hill, Kentucky only.

"I know in ordering this type of interlibrary loan material how specific you need to be in order for your librarian to be successful in borrowing the material. Should any of your readers need further help in this area, feel free to pass along my name and address."

For any of you who might have a particular interest in the Shakers of Pleasant Hill, there is a beautiful eight-page article on the Pleasant Hill establishment in the August 1992 issue of AMERICANA magazine. Also, the September 1992 issue of COUNTRY AMERICA carries an article on the same subject.

ANOTHER HISTORIC BONNELL HOUSE



The Bonnell House in Chatham, NJ, was the subject of an article in The Sunday Star-Ledger, Newark/NJ, on 15 December 1991. Copies of the article were submitted by Clement H. Bonnell, Richard Lesser and Claude Bunnell. The old landmark was leased in September 1991 by interior design specialist Vivian Anderson. While living in the house, she is working hard at its restoration. It was open to the public throughout the holiday season in 1991.

The house stands at 32 Watchung Avenue, Chatham, on a knoll overlooking the Passaic River. It was built in 1750 by Nathaniel Bonnell. Although the number of Nathaniel Bonnells is confusing, this was apparently Nathaniel Bonnell III, CB290025, who was born in 1696 in Elizabethtown, NJ. He married Joanna (or Hannah) Miller. Nathaniel bought land along the Passaic River at Chatham. He and his descendants were prominent in the industrial history of Chatham for many years. They built and operated several mills at dams they constructed across the Passaic.

The home remained in the Bonnell family until 1910. Now Ms. Anderson is giving it a new lease on life. She says, "Maybe someday we will get the house listed on both state and national registers, but first things first. I want to be able to buy the landmark and share it with the public." She has decided to make the house a permanent exhibition area.

Leila Mae Winans Bacon, Wyoming County's oldest resident, died Tuesday, November 3, 1992 at the Carpenter Care Center in Tunkhannock, PA.

The 106-year-old Meshoppen native inspired many with her quick wit, proud bearing and simple philosophy.

Born in Meshoppen Twp. on January 24, 1886, Mrs. Bacon was the daughter of Newell and Anna Davison Winans, and grew up on a farm outside Meshoppen.

Mrs. Bacon was a graduate of Meshoppen High School, Class of 1905 and married John Bacon, a Bunnell Hill dairy farmer, on Dec. 16, 1906.

Mr. Bacon passed away just nine years after their marriage. Mrs. Bacon left the world of farming and moved to Tunkhannock, where she worked in factories, took in boarders and ran a restaurant for a few years.

In addition to being a member of the Meshoppen High School alumni association, Mrs. Bacon was an active member of the Tunkhannock United Methodist Church and served as the church organist there for a number of years.

She maintained a home on Putnam Street in Tunkhannock for many years and was an active Republican who made it a point to vote in every election. Even in her last years, Mrs. Bacon kept a radio nearby so she could keep abreast of local and world affairs.

To Wyoming County, Leila Bacon was a living history, a tribute to a pioneering spirit and old-fashioned values and determination.

Her survivors include two nephews, Ernest "Skeet" Benninger of Dimock and Robert Phillips of California. Funeral services were held Thursday from the Sheldon-Kukuchka Funeral Home in Tunkhannock with the Rev. Mary Ricketts, associate pastor of the Tunkhannock United Methodist Church, officiating.

Interment was in the Overfield Cemetery, Meshoppen.

Gwen Quickel, Lake Jackson, TX, has an interesting question for us.

A television program, aired on AMC TV on 17 January 1992, presented This is Your Life to Gail Storm, of the TV show *My Little Margie*. An old film clip showed pictures of Gail Storm with her husband. Lee Bonnell. Gail and Lee met in Hollywood in 1939 when she was 16 years old. They had a long marriage and were the parents of three sons. Lee was no longer living in January 1992.

Gwen was astonished by the striking resemblance she found between the pictures of Lee Bonnell and her own husband, Edward Charles Quickel, Jr. Ed's father was born Edward Charles Bonnell CB010238, son of Stephen Ernest Bonnell CB007267, but assumed his step-father's surname at the time of his marriage. Gwen has done a great deal of research to uncover Ed's Bonnell ancestry.

Gwen took some pictures of the TV screen which she sent along with a picture of Ed at about the same age. I must admit the resemblance is very strong. Unfortunately, the pictures are not clear enough to reproduce in the Newsletter.

Now her question is, who was Lee Bonnell? What is his lineage? Can two people, both Bonnells, who look so much alike not be closely related? My records offer no help, and I couldn't find any reference to Lee Bonnell in the Database. Can anyone help?

A CURRENT RESEARCH PROJECT

Two of my correspondents are engaged in an intensive study of their ancestor DAVID BUNNELL.

I first heard from Mrs. Bertha Groothouse, La Cygne, KS, who is descended from David's daughter Mary Adeline (Bunnell) Paslay. About a year later Mrs. Marjorie Gibbs, Union Springs, NY, wrote to me. Her line is through David's daughter Louisa Jane (Bunnell) Cox.

David Bunnell was one of the Kentucky Bunnells about which I wrote in Newsletter vol. VI, No. 2. It appears that there must be a connection between David and the other Kentucky Bunnells, particularly the family of Jonathan, but finding the connection has become very frustrating.

However, the two ladies are pulling together a great deal of information about these intertwined families, and gradually they are building up a picture of David's family. Claude Bunnell is helping with data from his Database. I furnished an analysis of the information on hand early in November. Since then I have received lengthy letters from both ladies and from Claude. Now it is my turn again to comment.

I am hopeful that before this study is completed we will find the clues we need to determine David's parentage. If so, it may well throw light on the parentage of one or more of the other Kentucky Bunnells. A number of our subscribers would be eager for that information. If any of you want to be kept informed of progress or would like to take part in the study, please let me know.
