COMMENT

This time I nave chosen to focus on a couple of problem lineages which, if we can solve them, will be very helpful to several subscribers. Although I don't have the answers to these problems, I think it may be useful to bring together miscellaneous data from my files which might apply, with the hope that those of you who are searching may be able to find clues here which will lead you to the proofs we need. Since I have not given much coverage in the Newsletter to the Bonnell families in the South, I want to start with an article on one of those branches. The article turned out to be too long for one Newsletter, so I will have to finish it in January.

WHO WAS ARCHIBALD BONNELL? - PART I

The Bonnell families of Burke and Screven counties, GA, are almost certainly descendants of Huguenot settlers in the vicinity of Charleston, SC. I have received quite a lot of miscellaneous information about them, but some of it is confusing if not actually contradictory. Archibald Bonnell must belong to this family, but the connection still eludes us. Perhaps this analysis will help to focus the research by his descendants.

Y-1. CB005192. ARCHIBALD BONNELL was born in Burke co, GA, 1 January 1802 (or 1793). He married (first) JULIA REBECCA ELLIS(T)ON, daughter of Robert and Sarah (Hargraves) Ellis(t)on. She was born about 1804 in Burke co, GA. They appear in the 1830 census in District 68 (or District 65), Burke co, GA: 200001-01001-4 slaves, and in the 1840 census in District 724, Muscogee co, GA: 002001-110101. Julia Rebecca died 17 September 1844 in Muscogee co, GA, and Archibald married (second) ANN BRYAN(T).. He married (third) ANNE ELIZA SWEET (FREEMAN), who was born 31 December 1812 in Marion co, SC. She was the mother of two children, Sarah E. and Tandy R. Freeman, by her first husband. By 1850 Archibald and Anne K. Bonnell had two children and were living in Muscogee co, GA, where they appear in the census that year; in 1860 they were in Barbour co, AL. By January 1868 they were living in Texas. He died 8 (or 18) June 1879 in Shelby co, TX.

That's a summary of the information I have gathered about Archibald and his family. Following are quotes from some of the source material which has been sent to me together with my thoughts and comments about it.

► HISTORY OF CHATTAHOOCHEE COUNTY, GA, by Norma Kate Rogers, 1933 page 307:

"BONNELL

"During land lottery of 1827 Archibald Bonnell of Burke Co. Ga. drew 57 in 20th D. of original Lee. also drew a lot in Coweta Co.

"In 1847 he was living near Jamestown. From census of 1850: Archibald Bonnell age 47, with \$5,300; b. Burke Co. Ga.; (his wife) Ann E. age 38; Marion Co.; John, age 21; Burke Co.; Narcissa, age 11; Muscogee Co.; Laodicea E., age 10; Muscogee Co., Louisa, age 9 mos., Muscogee Co. Sarah 5. and Tandy R. Freeman also inmates of this home.

"Archibald Bonnell applied for dismission as Admr. of Est. of Needham Bryas."

[Comment - Muscogee co, GA, was formed in 1826, in part from Lee co. Muscogee co included most of what is now Chattahoochee co until after 1850.

-I have been unable to locate Jamestown on any Georgia map available to me.

-There is a conflict between the ages of Louise, age 9 months at the time the 1850 census was taken, and that of Orra Tichnor, born 31 January 1850. Orra should have appeared on the 1850 census if she were born on that date.

-Was Needham Bryas (sic) a relative of Archibald's second wife Ann Bryan(t)?]

> Letter 16 December 1960 to me from Mrs. Howard C. Parker, Center, TX.

"My gr. grandfather Archibald Bonnell was born in Burke co., Ga. in 1802 and died in Shelby co. in 1879. He married 1st Julia Ellison and they had two children. Narcissus Frances and John. 2nd Anne E. (Sweet) Freeman (my gr. grandmother), she had two children, Tandy R. and Sarah Freeman. By 1850 Archibald and Anne E. Bonnell had two children and were living in Muscogee co., Ga., in 1860 they were in Barbour co., Ala. Do not know the year they came to Texas but feel sure it was just after the Civil War, I know they were here in January of 1868."

ARCHIBALD BOMNELL (Cont'd)

► Mrs. Parker wrote to me again on 1 February 1961 and sent me a copy of a report on the BONNELL(BONNEAU) FAMILY, prepared for her by Mrs. Lane, a genealogist in Atlanta, GA. Excerpts from the report:

"Anthony Bonnell married about 1777 Mary Ann Mills. Their oldest son, William Bonnell, born April 2, 1779. Will dated 19 Nov. 1804, filed in Screven Co. Ga. 3 July 1809 Book "E" p 7. Mentioned: Wife: Mary; Sons: William, Anthony; G.Sons: John and Elias; G.Dau: Elizabeth Bonnell; "Heirs": Archibald Mills, Henry Bryant, Anthony Bonnell, Jr., Thomas F. Lovett & William Bonnell."

"Anthony Bonnell Sr., deceased, admr. Bond, 16 Feb. 1832 Bond Book "A" p 123, Screven Co. Ga. Anthony Mills) Admrs. ARCHIBALD BONNELL) Bond filed at Jacksonboro, Screven Co. Ga."

[Comment-Anthony Bonnell, Sr., listed two sons, William and Anthony, Jr., in his will in 1804. Presumably no other sons were then living. THE ROSTER OF REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS IN GEORGIA, by Mrs. Howard McCall, 1968, lists also a son Daniel. I have not found any other reference to this Daniel, but if we assume this reference is correct and that Daniel died before 1804, it is logical also to assume that the grandchildren listed in the will, John, Elias and Elizabeth Bonnell, were Daniel's children (or if not Daniel's, children of a deceased son whose name has not been found). William's daughter, Sarah, b. 1800, was not listed, nor were the Lovett children, and it is probable that Anthony did not mention any of the children of his living sons and daughters. Archibald Mills, Henry Bryant and Thomas F. Lovett were his sons-in-law.

-Probate on the estate of Anthony, Sr., was not completed until 1832, after the death of Anthony's widow. By that time, both of the sons mentioned in the will had also died. Anthony Mills and Archibald Bonnell were appointed administrators of the estate. I suggest that they were grandsons of Anthony, Sr. Anthony Mills was probably the son of Anthony's daughter Elizabeth, who married Archibald Mills. Archibald Bonnell was probably the son of either Anthony, Jr., or William.)

► Letter to me 30 June 1991 from Jack P. Dean, Jackson, MS

"My g-g grandfather was Archibald Bonnell, b. 1 Jan 1802 Burke Co., GA, d. 18 Jun 1879 Shelby Co., TX. M. (1) Julia Rebecca Ellis[t]on, (2) Anne Bryan[t], (3) Anne Eliza Sweet (my gg-grandmother b. 31 Dec 1812 Marion Co., SC, d. 12 Oct 1877 Shelby Co., TX). Since Archibald and Anthony Mills were administrators de bonis non of the estate of Anthony Bonnell, Sr. (1739/40-1809), R.S., after the latter's widow had died 22 Jan 1832, I have good reason to believe that he was a grandson of Anthony Bonnell, Sr. and probably was named after his likely uncle, Archibald Mills. He doesn't appear to have been the son of Anthony, Jr., so whose son was he?"

► From the PRODIGY Genealogy Bulletin Board, 29 June 1993, Jack Dean to James Bonnell:

"I am a descendant of Archibald BONNELL and his third wife, Ann Eliza SWEET Freeman, b. 31 Dec 1812, Marion Dist., SC, d. 12 Oct 1877, Shelby Co., TX. Their daughter, Orra "Orrie" Tichnor BONNELL, b. 31

ARCHIBALD BONNELL (Cont'd)

Jan 1850, Muscogee Co., GA, d. 2 Oct 1931, Center, Shelby *Co.*, TX; m. ca. 1870 William Joseph "Buck" PEARCE, b. 2 Dec 1847, Ouachita Co., AR, d. 9 Apr 1937, Center. Shelby Co., TX."

From the evidence cited above it is reasonable to assume that Archibald Bonnell, the estate administrator in 1832 in Screven co, was a grandson of Anthony Bonnell, Sr. our subject, Archibald Bonnell CB005192, was still living in Burke co, adjacent to Screven co, in 1830. It is tempting to believe that the two are one and the same. However, there is a fly in the ointment. The 1830 census in Burke co, GA, reveals TWO Archibald Bonnells living there.

- 1. In District 68 (CB Database says Dist. 65) Archibald Bennell lists 2 males under 5 and 1 male of 30 to 40 years [probably should be 20 to 30]; 1 female of 5 to 10 and 1 female of 20 to 30. Comparison with the 1840 and 1850 census records makes it clear that this is our subject.
- 2. In District 64 (CB Database says Dist. 61) Archibald Bonnell lists 1 male of 5 to 10, 1 male of 10 to 15 and 1 male of 20 to 30; 3 females under 5, 1 female of 5 to 10 and 1 female of 20 to 30.

I have seen no other reference to the second Archibald Bonnell any place. Did he die before 1840 or did he move away? If he appears again in some census record elsewhere we haven't found it yet. Perhaps the name was misread and he was not a Bonnell at all. Has anyone looked at the original record, or does this information come from the printed index? In the meantime it leaves the possibility that this is the administrator of Anthony Sr.'s estate, making the ancestry of our subject more mysterious than ever.

For the sake of argument, however, let's assume that our subject, Archibald Bonnell CB005192, was the administrator of Anthony's estate and therefore probably Anthony's grandson. Who, then, was his father?

For the second problem we move north to New Hampshire and Vermont.

i SETH BUNNELL CB310116, A SUGGESTED FAMILY

SETH BUNNELL, #41vi in Ruth Duncan's book, WILLIAM BUNNELL AND HIS **DESCENDANTS**, has been a problem to trace. Subsequent to the publication of her book, we determined that he had at least one son, Lucius Doolittle Bunnell. In this article I bring together a number of loose records which I suggest make a coherent picture of Seth and his family. Further proofs are necessary to establish that the picture is accurate, but perhaps this will stimulate the search for the necessary proofs.

Seth Bunnell, son of Jesse and Mehitable (Royce) Bunnell, was baptized 9 December 1770 in the Episcopal Church at Bristol, Hartford CO, CT.

[FAMILIES OF ANCIENT NEW HAVEN, Jacobus, Vol. 2, P. 366.]

or he was baptized 9 December 1770 In St. Matthew's Episcopal Church, East Plymouth, Litchfield co, CT.

(WILLIAM BUNNELL AND HIS DESCENDANTS, Duncan, p. 38.]

Seth received a bequest in his father's will dated 7 June 1782.

[WILLIAM BUNNELL AND HIS DESCENDANTS, Duncan, p. 38, and CB Database, ref. PBN-CT003-Farmington-0391. Can anyone get me a copy of Jesse's will?]

Seth sold land in Bristol, CT, to his brother Jesse in 1793.

[Letter to me from Roxana Smith, 24 Feb. 1993.]

Seth was a blacksmith in Claremont, MH. He moved to Canada and the family lost track of him.

[Family records sent to John A. Biles from a descendant of Seth's brother Beta on 20 Aug. 1907 and from a descendant of Seth's sister Mehitable on 13 Dec. 1915.]

Lucius Doolittle Bunnell, born December 1826 at Claremont, NH, was the son of Seth A. and Olive Bunnell.

[The record of the second marriage of Lucius D. Bunnell states the names of his parents. Photocopy sent to me by Roxana Smith.]

In 1903 Seth Alva Bunnell, son of Lucius Doolittle, told an inquiring family member that his grandfather's name was Seth, that he was a blacksmith and that he went to Canada.

[Letter 20 August 1907 from Mrs. Eugene W. Bunnell to John A. Biles.]

Olive Ashley, b. 1788, daughter of Col. Samuel and Lydia (Doolittle) Ashley, married Seth Bunnell, of Derby, VT, and removed to Canada.

[DOOLITTLE FAMILY GENEALOGY, pages 271 and 272. Photocopy sent to me by Roxana Smith.]

Seth and Olive Bunnell had another son, Levi D. Bunnell.

[Data sent to me 12 Oct. 1987 by Ruth C. Duncan listing her source as Mrs. Roxana A. Smith, Warren, NH.]

All the above data seems to hold together fairly well, but it raises some questions. When Lucius Doolittle Bunnell was born in 1826 his parents were age 56 and 38 respectively. Surely Lucius was not the first, or even the second, child. It seems probable that Seth had a previous wife. Olive was 18 years younger than he.

A number of other disconnected records have been found which, if they can be proved to fit together/ would fill out the picture in a logical way;

1. A Seth Bunnell qualified as a freeman of the state of Vermont by taking the oath required by law on 27 March 1790 in Derby, VT.

[HISTORY OF DERBY, VT, Chapter 8, p. 34.]

2. A Seth Bunnell married Rebeckah Rice on 2 April 1797 in Claremont, NH.

[Marriage record copied in Concord, NH, by Becky Rutledge and passed on to me by Clifton Cilley.]

3. Alvah Bunnell, born about 1804, married Catherine McCormick 30 August 1846 at St. Mary's Cathedral, Burlington, VT. Alvah died 16 April 1851 in Burlington at the age of 47 and was buried in St. Joseph cemetery in Burlington.

[From a record found in the vital Records in Montpelier, VT, by Becky Rutledge.]

4. Harriet E. Bunnell of Derby, VT, married Jesse W. Spencer in Derby on 26 June 1837.

[From a record found in the Vital Records in Montpelier, VT, by Becky Rutledge,]

5. Horatio Nelson Bunnell was born in 1803 in Burlington (or Derby), VT. His nine children left many descendants.

[From several sources, but primarily from information sent to me by Clifton Cilley, a great great grandson of Horatio Nelson Bunnell.]

6. Eli Bunnell was born 12 June 1819 in Standeel Lawn (or Standeck Laun) Canada. He married in Georgia and had three children, Alvah Alonzo, Emma Pease, and Theodora Augusta Bunnell. The town of Bunnell, FL, was named after the son Alvah Alonzo Bunnell.]

(Information sent to me by Mary Augusta ,Vann, daughter of Alvah A. Bunnell]

7. Eli Bunnell appears in the 1860 census in Lake City, Columbia co, FL, where his age is given as 49, born in Vermont.

[Information in Claude Bunnell's Database.]

8. I cannot find Standeel Lawn (or Standeck Laun as it was given by Mrs. Vann's brother-in-law Elmer Hall), but Stanstead co, Quebec» and the town of Stanstead lie immediately across the border in Canada from Derby, VT. There is also a village of Stanhope in Stanstead co, so perhaps there is or was also an obscure community called Standeel Lawn.

- A Seth Bunnell appears in the 1810, 1830 and 1840 census records in Derby, Orleans co, VT: 1810: 3 males under 10, 1 male 16 to 26, 1 male 26 to 45, 2 females 10 to 16, 1 female over 45.
 - 1830: 1 male under 5, 1 male 50 to 60,1 female under 5, 2 females 5 to 10, 1 female 10 to 15, 1 female 40 to 50.
 - 1840: 1 male 10 to 15, 1 male 60 to 70, 1 female 10 to 15, 1 female 15 to 20, 1 female 50 to 60.

[Information in Claude Bunnell's Database.]

10. A Seth Bunnell died 2 March 1841 in Derby, VT, and was buried in the Derby center Cemetery.

[From a record found in the Vital Records in Montpelier, VT, by Becky Rutledge.]

From those fragments it is possible to put together a coherent account, with only a few minor inconsistencies, which could represent the life and family of Seth Bunnell:

SETH A.(Alvah?) BUNNELL, son of Jesse, was baptized 9 December 1770 in the Episcopal Church at Bristol, Hartford co, CT. Like most of his father's family, he removed to Claremont, Sullivan co, NH, where he was a blacksmith. Seth was mentioned in his father's will dated 7 June 1782. In 1793 he sold land in Bristol, CT, to his brother Jesse. He married (first) 2 April 1799, in Claremont, NH, REBECKAH RICE. A few days earlier, on 27 March 1799 he took the oath as a freeman of the State of Vermont in Derby, VT. He seems to have spent most of his life in Derby, on the Canadian border, but may have actually lived in Canada some of the time. He appears in the 1810 census in Derby, VT, apparently still with his first wife. Rebeckah died and he married (second) about 1825 OLIVE ASHLEY, who was born in 1788, daughter of Col. Samuel and Lydia (Doolittle) Ashley. Seth appears in the 1830 and 1840 census in Derby, VT, with his second wife. He died in Derby 2 March 1841 and was buried in the Derby center Cemetery.

Children (by first wife):

- 1. Levi D.
- 2. Horatio Nelson, b. 1803.
- 3. Alvah, b. about 1804.
- 4. Harriet, b. 1815-1819.

5. Eli, b. 12 June 1819 (or 1811 per census). probably others.

Children (by second wife):

6. Lucius Doolittle, b. December 1826. Perhaps others.

It is possible that the second marriage took place earlier, and that Harriet and/or Eli were children of the second marriage. However, Eli does not seem to appear in the 1830 census when he would have been 11 years old if the 1819 birth date is correct. If the 1811 birth date indicated by the 1860 census is correct, he would have been 19 years old and more likely would have left home.

Clearly, Lucius Doollttle Bunnell was Seth's son. Seth may also have been the father of Alvah, born about 1804. Note that Lucius D. named his first son Seth Alva. Eli Bunnell named his only son Alvah Alonzo. Horatio Nelson Bunnell had *sons* named Walter Seth, Alva, Levi Dexter, and willie Lucius. The names Lucius and Alonzo also appear in the families of other grandchildren of Jesse and Mehitable (Royce) Bunnell. Although these names do occur elsewhere in the Bunnell and Bonnell families, they are not common.

Obviously, there are many loose ends in this suggested outline. I would appreciate any help in proving or disproving the various possibilities.

<u>Ahira Lehman Bunnell</u> became an oil dealer in the oil regions in Bradford, McKean co, PA, where he died in 1904. His descendants settled in California.

<u>Weslev Sturdevant Bunnell</u> served in the Civil War, then moved to Sterling, IL, where he married Hannah A. Hadlock. They had one son, CLARENCE UDELL BUNNELLE, born 11 July 1866 in Sterling, IL. In 1882 they moved to Pasadena, CA. This family pronounced and spelled the name Bunnelle.

<u>Henry Clay Bunnell</u> married Lydia Martha Overfield and settled on part of the old homestead, which his father gave him. His son, WILLIAM OVERFIELD BUNNELL, was born there on 22 July 1867.

<u>Albert Bunnell</u> married Harriet Adelia Overfield. He also settled on a portion of the Bunnell homestead on Bunnell Hill. They had four sons and two daughters:

They took the opportunity to get a picture of the six young cousins together.

George R. Bonnell, 74, died August 7, 1993, in Hammond, Louisiana. Visitation was at the Harry McKneely & Son Funeral Home. Hammond, Tuesday, August 10. The funeral service was conducted Wednesday morning, and burial in the Montpelier, Louisiana, Cemetery. George was buried next to his wife Ella Mae (Adams) Bonnell, who died May 29, 1990.

Mr. Bonnell was born in Western Springs. Illinois, January 16, 1919. He later lived in La Grange and La Grange Park, Illinois, and graduated in 1936 from Lyons Township High School. He served with the U. S. Army Air Corps during World War II.

Mr. Bonnell graduated from Southeastern Louisiana University, in Hammond, Louisiana, and served as the University's alumni director from 1956-71 and 1981-83. He also was alumni director of Louisiana State University from 1970-81.

Ruth Duncan, West Simsbury, CT, submitted three obituaries:

From the Hartford Courant, 14 Feb. 1993:
