GAIL STORM, MRS. LEE BONNELL

In the last Newsletter I noted Althea Station's information indicating that Everett Lee Bonnell CB006077 was the Lee Bonnell who married Gail Storm.

Clem Bonnell went right to work and learned that Gail Storm was in fact the stage name of Josephine Cottle. In his latest letter Clem writes,

"I talked to all of Gale Storm's children who were very nice. Her son Peter lives in Juneau, Alaska, told me she probably would want to talk to me. He said she was very down to earth. He suggested that she call me and she did! We weren't home so she left her number on our answering machine. Well, I called her back and she is a delightful person to talk to. She said she would send me a copy of her book. She also said that God had given her two wonderful husbands. She remarried in 1988 to Paul Masterson. She said she never thought she would marry again after Leroy died."

Clem also sent along family records he obtained from Mrs. Thelma (Bonnell) Hinkle, Everett Leroy's sister, and from Paul Bonnell, his son.

The book he mentioned was Gail storm's autobiography, written in 1981. Ms. Storm had had a difficult struggle with alcoholism, and the book was written in part to help others facing the same problem.

When Gwen Quickel learned about the book from Clem Bonnell, she borrowed a copy on interlibrary loan and sent me a brief abstract of the genealogical data from it. Gwen's interest was sparked, you will recall, by the strong resemblance between her husband Edward C. Quickel, Jr., and Lee Bonnell. These two pictures explain her interest:

Although they were fourth cousins once removed, the relationship between Ed Quickel and Lee Bonnell was somewhat closer than appears at first glance. We find that Jonathan Bonnell, Lee's ancestor, married Ruth Milburn. William Bonnell, Ed's ancestor and Jonathan's brother, married Ann Milburn, Ruth's sister. Thus the next generation had the same number of grandparents they would have had if they had been siblings instead of cousins. Perhaps that helps to explain the resemblance.

Gail Storm (Cont'd)

Here is what I have learned so far about Everett Leroy (Lee) Bonnell and Josephine (Gail Storm) Cottle:

CB006077. EVERETT LEROY (LEE) BONNELL, son of Lowell Wade, was born 24 (or 27) November 1918 at Royal Center, Cass co, IN. He attended Indiana University. In early 1939 in Indianapolis he took part in and won the "Gateway to Hollywood contest." The same contest was held in other cities, and a 17-year-old girl from Texas, Josephine Cottle, was the other winner. As a result, they were sent to Hollywood, where Lee became "Terry Belmont," and Josephine became "Gail Storm." They were both given bit parts in the movies.

On 28 September 1941, in Houston, Harris co, TX, LEE BONNELL and JOSEPHINE OWAISSA COTTLE were married. She was born 5 April 1922 in Bloomington, Victoria co, TX. Her family moved to Houston when she was two or three years old.

In the early 1940's Terry Belmont acted in a number of films, including, for example. <u>Too Many Girls</u>, with Van Johnson, Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz; <u>Parachute Battalion</u>, with Robert Mitchum and Bill Williams; <u>Lady Scarface</u>, with Judith Anderson; and <u>The Navy Comes Through</u>, with Desi Arnaz, Pat O'Brien, Jackie Cooper and George Murphy. His military service during World War II was in the United States Coast Guard.

After the War Lee Bonnell ended his acting career, and in 1950 entered the insurance business, which he pursued successfully for many years.

Josephine, as Gail Storm, on the other hand, continued in the acting profession in a career which embraced not only the movies, but television and the stage as well. She achieved stardom in 1944 in the film Where Are Your Children? On television she starred in two comedy series, Mv Little Margie, and Oh! Susanna, which ran for eight years and 269 performances.

In 1981 Gail wrote the story of her life and her battle to conquer alcoholism in the book <u>I Ain't Down</u> <u>Yet.</u> The same year she and Lee celebrated their 40th Wedding Anniversary.

Lee died 12 May 1986 at Los Angeles, CA. in 1988 Josephine married (second) Paul Masterson.

NATHANIEL BUNNELL/BONNELL

William and Ann (Wilmot) Bunnell had two sons to carry on the family name, Benjamin and Nathaniel. The descendants of both of them used both names over and over again. This has made genealogical research extremely complicated. Lately I have spent a lot of time trying to sort out all the Nathaniels. (The Benjamins will come later.)

It is interesting to note that more than 40 men in this family have been named Nathaniel, but the last one was born in 1853. Since then the name has never appeared again in any record that I have seen.

Genealogically, there are two general problems with these Nathaniels. First, there are many references in the various records which we have been unable to assign definitely to one or other of the known Nathaniels. Sometimes this is because there are several possible Nathaniels, and sometimes because we know of none who could apply.

Second, as I review the material, I find a number of instances where I have to question the identification which has previously been made, in my own work and in that of others. To further complicate matters, of the 41 Nathaniels listed below, fully 15 were themselves sons of Nathaniels. There is even one sequence of five generations of Nathaniels in a single unbroken line.

In the next several issues I will explore some of the problems. Perhaps some of the questions can be answered, and others can be exposed for further study. To begin with, here is a list of the Nathaniels who are believed to be descendants of William Bunnell:

In addition there are two other Nathaniels, whose parentage is known, but for whom the descent from William has not yet been learned;

CB000352. Nathaniel Bunnell, 1775-1830, son of Jonathan CBO 01.6 04, married Eleanor Granger. 4 children.

CB009287. Nathaniel Bonnell, 1849-????, son of Henry CB009285, son of John CB005685, son of the Aaron Bonnell CB002140 who married Ann Brotherton.

We will refer to this list frequently as we pursue the subject in the next several issues.

Taking a look first at the Connecticut branch, descendants of William's son Benjamin, there are two individuals on the list about whom I have questions:

1. In the fourth generation, CB290045 Nathaniel Bunnell 1718-1767, son of Nathaniel CB280011. The only reference I have found for this person is in Claude's Database. He notes a single reference: 1767 Death Record - Age 49, citing the Vital Records of Cheshire, CT-VP-P507. It is difficult for me to believe that this Nathaniel could have reached the age of 49 years without leaving any other record, when you consider the thoroughness of the vital records in Wallingford and Cheshire respecting all the other members of the family of Nathaniel CB280011.

I wonder if this is not a misreading of the year of death in the Cheshire Vital Records. Note that Nathaniel Bunnell CB300063 died in Cheshire in December 17.87 in his 49th year. He was, buried in the old Graveyard in Cheshire, where his gravestone read:

"In Memory of Capt. Nathaniel Bunnell who died Decbr 29th AD 1787 in the 49th Year of his age."

I suggest that CB290045 Nathaniel is the same person as CB300063, son of Ebenezer, and that CB280011 Nathaniel did not have a son Nathaniel.

2. In the seventh generation, CB320683 Nathaniel Bunnell, 1776-1776, son of Nathaniel CB310121. Claude's Database gives his date of birth as 1776 and his date of <u>death</u> as 26 June 1776 in Farmington,

Hartford co, CT. The Database does not indicate any source for this information. I called Claude and learned that his source was the Barbour File in the Connecticut State Library, reference #LR22, Page 460.

The Database identifies the father Nathaniel as CB310121. However, he would have been just 18 years old in June of 1776. We know that he was married at least twice, but his earliest known children were not born until ten or twelve years after 1776.

In 1961 Mrs. Clarence Bunnell, Winsted, CT, sent me a list of the births in Farmington, CT, "copied from the Barbour Collection of Vital Records found in the State Library, Hartford, Connecticut." On this list we find:

"Nathaniel, s. Nathaniel deed., b. June 26, 1776."

The papers of Ruth Duncan, which she turned over to me after she completed her book, include several pages of Farmington vital Records, Including:

"B(birth) Nathaniel 1776 26 June LR22 p460 Nathaniel, deceased (father)."

Also from Ruth's records, I found the Church Records she copied in the Connecticut State Library Collection. Two items:

"Nathaniel and wife Abigail, their male child b 26 June 1776 -West Avon Cong ch."

"Nathaniel died Oct. 1776 in the Northern Army - Avon Cong ch."

[Note that Avon and Farmington are adjacent towns.-wra]

Again from Ruth's records (a treasure trove), is an item she copied in the Connecticut Probate Records which indicates that in 1778 Abigail Bunnell was appointed guardian of Nathaniel, a minor, age 14. Her list is typed, but in pen Ruth calculated a birth date of 1764. (Somehow this got transmuted to 1769 in her book.) She also noted in pen "or 14 months!" and I believe that is correct.

I submit that CB320683 Nathaniel is the same person as CB310063 in generation 6, son of Nathaniel and Abigail (Abernathy) Bunnell. The Barbour record did not indicate the death of the child in 1776, but rather the birth of a child to a deceased father. The record must have been entered several months after the birth, since the father's death did not occur until October 1776. CB310121 Nathaniel did not have a son Nathaniel.

SUE BENNETT COLLEGE INAUGURATES PRESIDENT

LONDON—Former Urbana University chief Paul G. Bunnell was inaugurated as president of Sue Bennett College yesterday.

Bunnell, 51, a Methodist minister, became the institutions's ninth president. Bunnell succeeds Joan Stivers, 70, who retired this year after 34 years at Sue Bennett as a teacher, dean and, since January 1990, as president.

The London school has an enrollment of 500 students.

Bunnell is a graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University, the University of Toledo and United Theological Seminary in Dayton. He became president of Sue Bennett earlier this year after serving six years as president of Urbana University in Ohio, about 50 miles west of Columbus.

Bunnell, a father of two, was also a vice president for administration and assistant to the president of Defiance College in Defiance, Ohio, and the pastor of six Ohio churches in 1960-1984.
