She descends from William Bunnell through Benjamin, Benjamin, Solomon, Isaac, John, David, James Smitchell, David James and Frank Rhea Bunnell. Lida is the twelfth of thirteen children of Frank Rhea and Elizabeth Mary (Roberson) Bunnell.

The next day James and Marlyn Duff of Mew Berlin, WI, stopped in for a short visit. Jack Mowry, North East, PA, sent me a clipping from The New York Times of Sunday, 23 January 1994. The article, by Carole Gould, is headed "Fast Game, Fast Player, cash in Hand."

The subject of the article is Arthur J. Bonnel, whose picture was included. Little personal information was given, except that he was born 20 August 1945 in Oakland, CA. The first few paragraphs of the article follow on the next page:

"Talk about confident. Arthur J. Bonnel predicts that the Dow Jones Industrial Average will hit 9,000 by the end of the 1990's, and he aims to be 'mutual fund manager of the decade' by then--an awfully big bet even for a manager who works out of Reno, Nev.

But his bets have paid off before. Mr. Bonnel's MIM Stock Appreciation Fund returned 20.4 percent a year, on average, for the five years ended 1993, according to Morningstar Inc., fund researchers in Chicago.

To keep up, however, investors may need cast-iron stomachs. Mr. Bonnel plies his trade in fast-moving growth stocks, tilted toward technology issues, and he flips his portfolio frequently. That leads to some big highs and some big lows: The fund crashed in the 1990 bear market, for instance, plunging 16.3 percent that August, double the average growth fund's loss; then it finished the year in the top 5 percent of its group. In 1991, it soared 77 percent.

### EARL S. BUNNELL, 79

NEW HAVEN — A Mass of Christian burial will be celebrated Thursday for Earl S. Bunnell, 79, of 315 Eastern St., who died Monday, June 6, 1994, in Yale-New Haven Hospital after a brief illness. He was the widower of Camille Ferraro Bunnell.

The funeral will leave the Keenan Funeral Home, 238 Elm St., West Haven, at 9:30 a.m. The Mass will be at 10 in Our Lady of Victory Church, West Haven. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery, North Haven.

Before retiring Mr. Bunnell was a marine rigger for the C. W. Blakeslee Co. for many years. Son of the late Roy I. and Viola Grubb Bunnell, he was born in Waterbury March 27, 1915. He was a world war n Army veteran.

He leaves a daughter, Linda Deloye of Waterbury; two sons, Martin Bunnell of Sunnyvale, Calif., and Francis Bunnell of Brooksville, Fla.; two sisters. Hazel Apuzzo and Helen Boyne, both of West Haven; eight grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

In July I published the obituary of Homer H. Bunnell, sent in by Mabel Daniels, Beacon, IA. After the Newsletter was sent out, I received a letter from Mabel giving Homer's ancestry. He was the son of Thomas Bunnell, grandson of Benjamin Franklin Bunnell, and great grandson of Benjamin P. Bunnell. Mabel Daniels is a great granddaughter of Benjamin Franklin Bunnell, and has been searching for a long time for the ancestry of Benjamin P. Bunnell CB005872. Recently I was able to suggest that he might have been the same person as the Benjamin Bonnell, who was born 5 June 1813 in Erie co, PA, son of Thomas and Eva (Coover) Bonnell and grandson of John and Nancy (Farrady) Bonnell. On circumstantial evidence we believe this to be correct, but I have not yet seen adequate proof.

Several of our subscribers are searching for the origin of John Bonnell CB004113. The name of his wife is given variously as Nancy Farrady or Betsy or Nancy Pandy. It has been suggested that either he or his wife, or both, were born in Ireland. As far as John is concerned, my personal belief is that he was born in New Jersey, a descendant of the Nathaniel Bonnell who settled in Elizabethtown in 1665. With no evidence, however, I am not prepared to defend that belief. It is said that John was born about 1757 or about 1753. The 1800 census indicates that he was over 45 in that year, so I lean toward the earlier date. He is difficult to follow in the records, since his name appears in so many different spellings. He appears first in the rolls of the Lancaster co, PA, militia, in 1776, 1779, 1781 and 1782, listed as John Bonnell, John Bundle, and John Burnell. Apparently, throughout this period he lived in what is now Dauphin co, PA, but was then part of Lancaster co.

Sometime before 1790, John moved his family (except for oldest son Thomas) to Northumberland co, PA, where he appears in the census that year as John Bundle. Northumberland co then included the area near Jersey Shore where John bought land in 1794. In 1795 this part of Northumberland co was set off as Lycoming co.

A few years later John sold his property in Lycoming co and moved to Erie co, PA. He appears there in the 1800 census as John Bonel and in the 1810 census as John Bunnell. He died in Erie co in 1845, but whether or not he lived there all that time is not clear to me. There is no record of him that I have found in the census data for 1820, 1830 or 1840. Perhaps he appears somewhere under another odd spelling of his name.

\* \* \* \* \*

Paul J. Bunnell of Marstons Mills, MA, sent in a clipping from the National Enquirer, 30 November 1993, describing the success of 28-year-old Tom Bunnell and his friend Dan Hoard. According to Dan, 28, of Seattle, WA, they were having fun in the surf one night and he wanted to make a pair of shorts out of his long pants. "I cut off the legs and put one leg on my head and tossed the other to Tom. We pulled the ends over our heads, looked at each other and laughed like crazy." What amused them should amuse others, and the two friends turned their joke into "the Mambosok hat." "We sold 1,000 of them in two weeks at \$10 each!" Since then sales have snowballed.

[This Tom Bunnell doesn't appear in my records. Can anyone help?]

In August Ralph Bunnell CB351620 and his wife Marion, from Kenmore, NY, visited us here at Camelot. They loaned me some fine old family pictures, several of which I will share with you. Ralph is a great grandson of Edmund and Eliza Rebecca (Overfield) Bunnell. For those of you who have copies of Ruth Duncan's book, WILLIAM BUNNELL AND HIS DESCENDANTS, Edmund is #233. Since I have acquired considerable additional information about this family, it seems worthwhile to give you an updated and corrected account:

EDMUND BUNNELL CB320057, son of Isaac and Anna Depew (Overfield) Bunnell, was born 29 August 1826 on Bunnell Hill in Meshoppen twp, Luzerne (now Wyoming) co, PA. on 6 February 1851 he was married by Rev. George Landon in the Braintrim Baptist church, Laceyville, Wyoming co, PA, to ELIZA REBECCA OVERFIELD, daughter of Paul and Lydia (Lacey) Overfield. She was born 3 September 1830 in Meshoppen twp. For the next ten years they lived in Auburn twp, Susquehanna co. PA, where they appear in the 1860 census. In 1861 they removed to Skinners Eddy, Braintrim twp, Wyoming co, PA, where he operated a general store for several years. [I have the Day Book in which he recorded the names of his customers and their purchases each day.] In 1864 he purchased the farm at Skinners Eddy where he spent the rest of his life. He is listed as a farmer in the census of Braintrim twp in 1870, 1880 and 1900.

Edmund and Eliza were members of the Skinners Eddy Methodist Episcopal Church. For 35 years Edmund was a trustee of the church, and he served as superintendent of the Sunday School for many years. In 1865 he joined Franklin Lodge No. 2G3, Free & Accepted Masons of Laceyville, and remained a member in good standing until his death. He died 21 September 1906 at his home in Skinners Eddy. His real estate was sold at orphan's court sale and purchased by his son Seth Keeney Bunnell for \$3700. Eliza continued to live there for a number of years. The picture shows her sitting in front of the house with some of her descendants in the summer of 1908 or 1909. She appears as a widow in the 1910 census of Braintrim twp. Eliza died 18 May 1917. She and Edmund were buried in Overfield Cemetery in Meshoppen twp.



### MORE ON NATHANIELS

The records of the Presbyterian Church of New Providence, Union co, NJ, were copied by Beacon Fire Chapter, D.A.R. Summit, NJ. Many years ago someone extracted from them the records pertaining to the families of Bonnell, Broadwell, Lacy and Simpson. A typed copy of this list was sent by Mrs. H. T. Jeffrey to Arthur Jay Lacy at an unknown date. In his old age Arthur Lacy gave all his genealogical material to his cousin Philip Lacy, who published the Lacy/Lacey Genealogy. In October 1970 Philip Lacy sent me a photocopy of the four-page list.

I mention this in such detail because I want to emphasize that my source is several times removed from the original entries in the church records, and I can't be sure that they have been copied each time completely, correctly, and without interpolations. They need to be checked against photocopies of the original records.

Following are the references to Nathaniel Bonnells exactly as they appear in the typed list: [I added the numbers in brackets for convenience in commenting on them.]

First, I'll correct several obvious errors:

- [3] Jayne Bonnell who married Abner Brown on 21 July 1763 was the daughter of Benjamin CB300043 and Rachel (Van Winkle) Bonnell, not of Nathaniel.
- [14] The two daughters listed, Rhoda and Abigail, were also daughters of Benjamin and Rachel (Van Winkle) Bonnell, not of Capt. Nathaniel.
- [15] The wife of Capt. Nathaniel who died 20 April 1774 was Elizabeth Allen, not Sibah Hoel.
- [18] Plebe Bonnell, b. 23 Feb. 1792 d. 4 Nov. 1845, was the wife of Jonathan Crane Bonnell CB320430, not of Nathaniel.

\* \* \*

After correction, three Nathaniels seem to be differentiated in the list: Capt. Nathaniel, Nathaniel, and Nathaniel, Jr. However, the designations do not appear to be consistent.

Capt. Nathaniel is listed as the husband of Sibah Hoel and Mary Simpson, and the father of William and Enoch.

Nathaniel is listed as the husband of Sibah Hoel, the father of Jane, Jonathan, Jacob, Elizabeth and Mary, and as the Revolutionary soldier who died in 1814.

Nathaniel, Jr., is listed as the father of Hulda, Mary, Jonathan Crane, Calvin, Luther and Philemon.

\* \* \*

Based on the overwhelming weight of available evidence, I can make these statements:

"Capt." Nathaniel Bonnell CB300178 married Mary Simpson as his second wife. However, his first wife was Elizabeth Allen, not Sibah Hoel. William and Enoch were the two youngest children of the second marriage. Jane, Jonathan, Jacob and Elizabeth, listed above as baptisms of the children of Nathaniel, were the four youngest children of his first marriage.

More on Nathaniels (cont'd)

Nathaniel Bonnell, Jr., CB310358 was the son of Capt. Nathaniel and Elizabeth (Allen) Bonnell. He married Martha Crane. According to OFFICIAL REGISTER OF THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF NEW JERSEY IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR, by William S. Stryker, he served as a private in both the New Jersey militia and the Continental Army. He died 15 April 1814, and is certainly the Revolutionary soldier buried in the Presbyterian church yard. He and Martha had eight children, among whom were Hulda, Mary (born 29 Feb. 1792), Jonathan Crane and Philemon, mentioned above. The child Mary, who died 30 January 1783, was not one of these.

\* \* \* \* \*

That leaves us with these loose ends:

A Nathaniel married Sibah Hoel on 19 Feb. 1772.

A Nathaniel, Jr., was the father of Calvin and Luther Bonnell, baptized on 10 April 1774.

A Nathaniel, Jr., was the father of Mary, who died 30 Jan. 1783.

Nathaniel and his wife Tibbah(Sibah) were the parents of Mary, who died 30 Jan. 1783 at the age of 7 years.

Who was this Nathaniel?

\* \* \*

John Littell, in his GENEALOGIES OF THE FIRST SETTLERS OF PASSAIC VALLEY, published in 1852, says that Nathaniel CB310308 [fourth child of Benjamin and Rachel (Van Winkle) Bonnel] "married, 19th February, 1772, Sibbe Howel, and had children: 1. Calvin; 2. Luther; 3. Elijah; 4. Lockey." No further record has been found of any of these children, and only Calvin and Luther appear in the baptismal records. Where John Littell found Elijah and Lockey is unknown. The child Mary, who died 30 January 1783, was apparently also the daughter of Nathaniel and Sibah.

This Nathaniel CB310308 moved from New Jersey to Junius, Seneca co, NY, where he bought land in 1806. By that time he had at least four children born between 1785 and 1797 (Permelia, Darius, Perthania and Nathaniel). He appears in Junius in the 1810 census without a wife and with only his son Nathaniel living with him. Before 1820 he married again, to Catherine \_\_\_\_\_. Nathaniel made his will in 1833 and named his wife Catherine and the four children, Permelia, Darius, Perthania and Nathaniel. He died in 1845, and apparently his wife predeceased him.

The fate of Sibah (Hoel) Bonnell is unknown. Did she and four sons all follow her daughter to an early grave? If so, their death and burial records have not yet turned up. It is possible that Sibah survived her first five children and then became the mother of four more who outlived her. However, Nathaniel, the youngest, would have been 25 years younger than Calvin and Luther. I think it is more likely that Nathaniel had another wife who was mother to the four surviving children.

Nathaniel CB310308 was not "Capt." Nathaniel, nor was he Nathaniel, Jr. At least he was not the son of a Nathaniel, although usage at the time would not have precluded his being called "Jr.", since there were older Nathaniels living in the area at the time.

More on Nathaniels (Cont'd)

In 1991 Claude Bunnell sent me a photocopy of a typed list of Bonnell extracts from the GENEALOGICAL MAGAZINE OF NEW JERSEY, Volumes 18 and 19, giving the records of the Presbyterian Church of New Providence. This list makes it clear that my earlier list summarized some of the data. I don't know whether this was done by the D.A.R. or by a later copyist. The magazine presented the baptisms in order as they occurred, instead of grouped by family. Also, Bonnel is spelled with one "1" throughout. None of the errors I cited above appear in this copy of the list.

In Claude's list, all references to Nathaniel as father of baptized children are given as Nath II, Capt. Nath II, or Nath.II,Jr. Claude read these as Nathaniel II, etc. My own conclusion is that Nath II, is simply an abbreviation for Nathaniel - Nath'11.

\* \* \*

Claude Bunnell came to a different conclusion about the Nathaniel who married Sibah Hoel. The marriage is listed on page 91 of Vol. 18: "Nathaniel Bonnel Mar. Sibah Hoel on Feb 19, 1772." The baptisms of Calvin & Luther Bonnel, Philemon Bonnel, Huldah Bonnel, Jonathan Crane Bonnel and Mary Bonnel, all show the father as "Nath.II Jr." We know definitely that the last four were the children of Nathaniel CB310358 and Martha (Crane) Bonnell. In Claude's opinion, this would indicate that Calvin and Luther were also the children of Nathaniel CB310358 by a previous wife. Therefore, in all probability, this was the Nathaniel who married Sibah Hoel. Claude believes that Nathaniel CB310308 would not have been called Nath.II.Jr., since his father was Benjamin.

Nathaniel CB310358 was born 3 June 1756. If he was married on 19 February 1772 he would have been only 15 years old. This seems very unlikely to me. It seems much more probable, in my opinion, that Nathaniel CB310308 would have been called Nathaniel, Jr., to distinguish him from his uncle Nathaniel CB300178 who was living in the same community at the time. Note that all references to this Nathaniel as "Jr." in the church records appear before any references to his cousin, the real Nathaniel, Jr.

There is only one other Nathaniel Bonnell, of whose existence I am aware, who could have been the husband of Sibah Hoel. That is Nathaniel CB300154, son of David. He married Ann Cozad in 1774, but he is thought to have had a daughter Phebe in 1772. I referred to this possibility in the Nathaniel article in the last Newsletter. The baptisms of Calvin and Luther in 1774 and the burial of Mary, daughter of Nathaniel and Tibbah, in 1783 throw strong doubt on this case, but it is possible to make at least a weak argument for it.

In summary, notwithstanding the problems and gaps in evidence, I tend to agree with John Littell that the husband of Sibah Hoel was probably Nathaniel CB310308, son of Benjamin.

I would be glad to publish the views of anyone who has other ideas or additional information to help throw light on this question.

In Volume VII, No. 4, I printed a picture of six Bunnell cousins which included Clarence Udell Bunnelle from Pasadena, CA, who was visiting his cousins in Pennsylvania. Clarence was the son of Wesley Sturdevant and Hannah (Hadlock) Bunnell.

A subscriber, Barbara Lee Lewis, granddaughter of Clarence Udell Bunnelle, sent a copy of the page to her aunt Lois (Bunnelle) Reid. Mrs. Reid responded with the following notes, which Barbara Lee passed along to me:

A reason for the Bunnells to be visiting in the Middle West was the price war railroads were having. I believe they got tickets for \$2.00.

Quoting from 'Pasadena Historical and Personal' written by J. W. Wood and published in 1917. (Page 16)

Wesley Bunnell paid \$2,000 for five acres. Northwest corner of Colorado and Marengo in 1881, through the agency, T. P. Lukens, and afterward concluded he had paid too much. Lukens offered to take it off of his hands at cost, but Bunnell refused. When the boom happened along, Bunnell was visiting in the East. He was wired \$10,000 for his land, and he refused it. The offer was raised to \$15,000 - he was excited but declined again, and took the next train home to interview the crazy man who offered it. Then he found the "Boom" had started, and found himself bombarded with offers. Finally he divided the property into lots and got \$120,000 for it in 1887. Parenthetically, it may be added that a lot sold from the tract by Bunnell for \$300 per foot in 1887, was bought back by him in 1890 for sixty-seven dollars per foot!' Cause: "Boom Busted." It is worth \$1,200 per foot now.

What I found so interesting is Grandpa Bunnell worked in the Burney Williams store where the first Pasadena telephone was installed, and was the first person in Pasadena to talk over the phone, quoting Wood "and a sweet girl had said 'Hello' over it to Wesley Bunnell." Another historian repeated the conversation as being from someone in the L.A. office, asking for a worker installing the phone. Grandpa was supposed to have said, "He isn't here."

In August Pat and I called on Mr. and Mrs. Laurence Bunnell CB350160 at their home on Devine Ridge, Rush twp, Susquehanna co, PA. (An account of their 50th Wedding Anniversary was published in Newsletter, Vol. VII, No. 3.) They are both active, interesting people, and we spent a very pleasant afternoon. Laurence brought out the Family Bible of his great grandfather Ephraim Kirby Bunnell, and I was able to copy all the family records from it. They also had lots of pictures, not only of the Bunnell family, but also of the Perigo and McKeeby families in which we were also interested. His personal recollections added many details and brought life to the bare statistics I previously had on his branch of the family.

#### THE SECOND CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES-1800

In Volume VI, No. 4, I published the Bunnell, Bonnell and Burnell entries in the first census of the United States. Several names I overlooked were added in the first issue of Volume VII. In this issue I will present the Bunnells and Bonnells in the census of 1800.

My sources were three: A census Index Report sent to me in 1978 by Accelerated Indexing Systems, Inc.; census data gathered by Ruth C. Duncan and sent to me with her notes following publication of her book; and Claude Bunnell's Database. A few discrepancies between the sources will appear below. I have not had an opportunity to check these against microfilms of the original records.

There would be many more Bonnells on the list if the 1800 census for New Jersey had not been lost. The Georgia census for that year is also missing - it would account for a few more. However, there should be Bonnells from the South Carolina census, but I did not find them in my sources. Please let me know of any omissions or errors that you find in this list.

The first column lists the surname, followed by the given name of the Head of Family. Next is the six digit CB# from Claude Bunnell's Database, then the state and county. The last column shows the enumeration of the family, as follows:
